Mr. Sales reported on January 17th the Board met with 25-30 high school students at a "Pizza and Conversation" forum. They discussed several topics and received some great feedback.

On January 18th Mr. Sales went to Nassau BOCES' 50th Anniversary Dinner. On January 19th, he attended the Suffolk County PTA's Annual Presidents'/Principals Dinner along with Dr. Bannon. Great Neck Road Elementary School received an award for membership. On January 20th, Mr. Sales, Mr. Greb and Dr. Bannon attended the WSBOCES Legislative Program. Mr. Sales also mentioned that he had attended the taping of the radio show that highlighted the District's two

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students that were Siemens Semi-Finalists. Finally, Mr. Sales reported that he attended the Advocacy Workshop along with several Board members and Dr. Bannon on January 21.

9. VOICE OF THE PEOPLE

Information: 9.1 Community Members May Address the Board

At this time, Mr. Sales read a statement that had previously been posted on the District Website and Facebook regarding the report and investigation of an incident that occurred early Friday, January 20, 2017 involving allegations that two high school staff members interrupted the educational process of a first period class in Walter G. O'Connell Copiague High School by engaging in a form of personal protest.

There were approximately 65 community members and interested parties in attendance at the meeting. Representatives from News 12, Newsday and the L. I. Press were also in attendance. Approximately 23 people spoke and / or addressed the Board regarding the incident referred to in the District's statement. Several of the 23 speakers were high school students. Statements made by the speakers included but were not limited to:

A resident who voiced his disappointment about what the two staff members did. There were some other residents that made statements agreeing with him.

A majority of the speakers made statements of support for the staff members. Many of those speakers stated a belief that the alleged conduct was protected by the First Amendment.

Many speakers also made general statements of support for the staff members and their abilities, without identifying them by name.

A resident expressed her belief that there was not enough diversity on the Board of Education or teachers they hire. Another speaker asked if the Board ever thought about Diversity Training.

At some point in that discussion, a resident who ran for the Board said the Board was very supportive of her. However, she did express that she would like to have seen the Board at the annual Martin Luther King Celebration.

Many of the speakers made inquiries about the Board's intent as it pertained to the employment of the staff members who were the subject of their inquiry.

Mr. Sales, Dr. Bannon and Mr. Clayton, District's Counsel, responded to certain inquires that were made by individuals who spoke. Mr. Clayton provided an overview of applicable laws relating to privacy and the rights of the individuals involved that limited the amount of information that could be shared in a public forum. Mr. Sales did assure everyone that these two staff members were not going to be fired.
