However, Mr. Leunig cautioned that there is much information that is unknown about RTTT. The District should know by mid April if New York State has won the RTTT. Additionally, Mr. Leunig reported on the Mid Winter Superintendent's Conference he attended in Albany over the weekend. The Governor will be coming out with a draft of the State Budget on January 19. Educational Aid is projected to take a big hit.
