Joseph Froehlich was valedictorian of Copiague High School's Class of 1989, excelling both in and out of the classroom. As an athlete, Joe was a two-year varsity starter on both the baseball team and the soccer team. During his senior year, Joe ran varsity winter track, finishing in the top five at the League Championship. In addition to sports, Joe competed in multiple academic competitions, captaining the Mentathlon Quiz Bowl team to a fourth-place finish in the county tournament in 1988, upsetting several larger schools and capturing an individual championship in the Social Studies event in 1989. As a member of Boy Scout Troop 284, Joe not only achieved the rank of Eagle, but also was the first scout from Suffolk County to ever receive the prestigious National Eagle Scout Scholarship.

After High School, Joe attended Fairfield University on an academic scholarship, graduating *magna cum laude* in 1993 with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. Joe then went on to law school at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, graduating with honors in 1996. At law school, Joe served as an editor on the North Carolina Law Review and had his student article on the "Right to Counsel" published. As a practicing attorney, Joe has specialized in complex commercial litigation. He has represented clients in matters before the United States Supreme Court and the highest New York State Court, the New York Court of Appeals.
