

This year, Charlotte County Public Schools, will have three more early release days, which are dedicated to Professional Learning for our staff. On these days, schools will dismiss two hours early.


Early Release Days: December 11, February 12, and April 30.

LATE BUS

This year, Port Charlotte Middle School will utilize the services of a late bus for PCMS-zoned students on Mondays through Thursdays after school. We hope this will allow more students the opportunity to be part of our extracurricular activities and tutoring services. A parent or guardian must

sign the Late Bus Permission Slip before a student can ride the late bus. Permission slips were sent home at the beginning of September.

A few things to remember:

- The stops made by the late bus are not the same as the normal bus stops. Please review with your child the route that he/she will need to take home. It is the student's responsibility to know which stop to exit the bus from. Please review the stop, as well as the safest route home. This should be done before riding the late bus.
- Students will use their student ID badge to scan themselves on and off the bus.
- Please remember that normal bus rules apply. Students will be held accountable if they violate bus rules and/or the Code of Student Conduct.











BADGE POLICY

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As part of our commitment to maintaining a safe and orderly environment, we would like to remind you of an important district policy regarding student identification.

All students are required to wear their school-issued ID badges at all times throughout the school day while on campus. This policy is in alignment with the district's safety and security protocols and aims to ensure that every individual on campus is properly identified.

Each student was provided an ID badge at the beginning of the school year. Should a badge be lost or damaged, the first replacement will be provided free of charge. Any additional replacements will be provided for a \$5 fee. Parents may pay any fees necessary through the Front Office, or students may pay fees through the Front Office before school, after school, or during lunch. It is crucial that students adhere to this policy. Failure to wear the ID badge may result in disciplinary action.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping us uphold this important aspect of our school's safety measures. Should you have any questions or require further information, please do not hesitate to contact Port Charlotte Middle School at 941-255-7460.

PE NEWS

The PE department has been working on establishing rules and procedures for class and safe, inclusive play with peers. Students were introduced to Hands only CPR techniques and should now know the steps to help in an emergency. (Call 9-1-1, push hard and fast in the center of the chest, keep pressing until help arrives and EMT's take over) They have also been introduced to a variety of cooperative games and activities, group and individual fitness goals and concepts, and PACERS. PACERS is a cardiorespiratory endurance run that challenges students to elevate their best score each time they run. They have the opportunity to improve their personal best score approximately every 3 weeks. They were also introduced to circuit training to learn fitness activities for a full body workout.

A couple reminders regarding PE uniforms and locks and make up work when missing class. Changing out is a part of your students' PE grade. Black shorts and grey shirt are preferred and can be purchased with a lock for \$20 at school (during PE) all year long OR you may purchase your own clothing/outfit outside of school and only pay the \$2 rental fee for the locker.

If your child misses a class due to an "in school" or "out of school" suspension (ISS or OSS), they can make up the missing grade for partial credit. ISS work should be requested from the ISS coordinator (Ms. Davis) and OSS work can be found on the teacher's CANVAS page. (classwork section)

INTRAMURALS

PCMS offers an intramurals activity (sports) club after school (weather permitting). The club runs Monday through Thursday after school from 4:10-5:10 p.m. ANY STUDENT may stay after school to participate in a choice of activities to include soccer, basketball, flag football, and volleyball (when the gym is available). Students need to get a consent to participate form from the gym and return it to Coach Hibbard or Coach Renne prior to participation. Students may stay whichever days they choose and work for their schedule. ALL behavioral expectations and pick up times should be followed or it may be cause for your student to be dismissed.

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
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REPORTING SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITIES OR THREATS
