Communication of Family Center and other school-wide events will be posted on our website, Facebook, Remind App, & in the weekly call to the primary care giver.

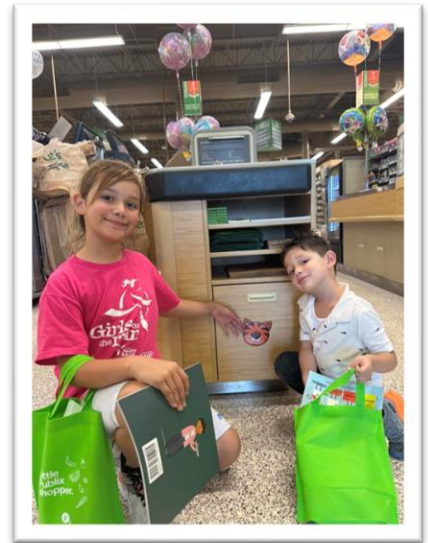
