a Note from your Principals

Welcome back Tigers! We have had a wonderful start to the 2023-2024 school year. Our students have settled into their new classrooms, learned routines and expectations, made many new friends and reunited with some old friends. They have also jumped right into their academics and have taken their beginning of the year STAR or FAST assessments. All of this groundwork of building a strong classroom culture and gathering data on our students helps our staff ensure that it will be a great school year both socially and academically for our Tigers.

As a parent, there are some ways that you can partner with us to help your child have a successful year. One essential component is communication! Parents are encouraged to connect with us through our school website, Facebook page, and our Instagram page, as well as through our recorded Sunday calls and the Remind app. These resources allow you to receive up-to-date school-wide information that is about school-wide information and upcoming dates, and to see photos of our daily life! Additionally, we encourage families to communicate with their child(ren)'s classroom teacher(s). Teachers have sent home information about their preferred method of communication for quick question, and will schedule conferences with you as needed. The partnership and support between the classroom and home is so important! We are all a team and we work together to help your child(ren) learn and grow this year!

In addition to communication, we need your support in getting your child(ren) to school on time, every day. Academic instruction begins promptly at 8:20. This means that students should be all of the way inside the school building, in their classroom, and unpacked ready to start the day before the tardy bell rings. We ask that you do your best to try to schedule appointments and travel after our school day ends at 2:50 also. Please help us by not sign out your child for early dismissal as much as possible. Did you know that a student missing just 5 minutes of instruction each day for 180 days is equal to missing 15 hours of instruction? One way to help tackle this is through attendance challenges. Ask your child to share with you if their grade level has earned an ice pop for winning an attendance challenge so far this year!

Finally, we are working hard to grow great leaders one habit at a time! Our students have been learning about the 8 Habits of Happy Kids. SJE is proud to be a Leader In Me Legacy School! Our young leaders have been learning how to set goals for themselves and how to put first things first to work hard to reach those goals. They have also learned to synergize, because working together with others to hear multiple perspectives often brings about new and better ideas. Habit One, Be Proactive, teaches students that they are in charge of themselves and their own choices. We expect our students to be responsible for the leadership decisions that they make each and every day. They are learning how the choices they make often have impacts on others around them. We are thankful to have supportive parents like all of you who also reinforce this idea with our students at home. We love seeing our Tigers showing kindness and respect to their peers and our staff. Bullying means to intentionally hurt someone physically, verbally or emotionally. It is unwanted, an imbalance of power, and repeated over a period of time


