FREE FUEL DISTRIBUTION

Each vehicle is limited to 10 gallons of fuel at Charlotte Sports Park, 2300 El Jobean Rd., Port Charlotte. The site is open daily from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. while supplies last.

PRIVATE WELL TESTING

Test your well water for free (while supplies last) if you are concerned that your private well may have been contaminated:

- 1. Pick up a kit from the Department of Health in Charlotte County Environmental Health office, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m., 1100 Loveland Blvd.
- 2. Follow the directions on the kit's instruction.
- 3. Take the water sample to the Benchmark Private Well Testing Laboratory, 1001 Corporate Ave., Suite 102, North Port.
- 4. Results will come from the lab.

SOLID WASTE SERVICES

Residential curbside collection has resumed the regular schedule. The **Mid-County** and **West Charlotte Mini-Transfer and Recycling Facilities** have reopened with an extended schedule of 9 a.m. to gates closing at 4:45 p.m. Monday-Saturday. **Charlotte County Landfill** is open 7 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday and 7 a.m.-12:30 p.m., Saturdays.

BUSINESS DISASTER LOANS

If you have business losses, including property damage and economic losses, you may qualify for assistance from the U.S. Small Business Administration. Visit lending.sba.gov.

PRICE GOUGING

State Price Gouging Hotline: 1.866.966.7226. Florida's price gouging law applies to items and services essential to getting ready for or recovering from a storm within the areas of a declared state of emergency. Visit MyFloridaLegal.com.

STORM DEBRIS

Sandbag Disposal: Do not put sand or sandbags in your regular trash or yard waste and do not mix it with yard debris. Store clean sandbags for future storms or spread the sand on lawns/landscape beds.

It is the property owners' responsibility to separate debris into these categories, placing the piles in county-maintained right-of-way, off the road, not on private property: construction & demolition materials, electronic waste (e-waste), household hazardous waste, white goods, vegetation, regular household garbage.

Do not place trash or debris around fire hydrants, backflow preventers, automated flushers, valve covers, water sample stations or water meter boxes.

DO NOT PUT SAND IN ROADS USE THE TWO SAND DROP-OFF SITES.

Two sand drop-off sites are open at the north end of the parking area in Englewood Beach at Chadwick Park, 2100 N. Beach Road in Englewood, and at 1 N. Gulf Blvd. on Don Pedro Knight Islands. The sand drop-off sites will be open 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily.

Do not put the sand on the beach - It is not allowed by the state and you may be fined. Let contractors know they can drop off sand (no dirt, no muck) for free. You may also empty sandbags at the site, but do not leave bags and containers at the site.

PORTABLE GENERATOR SAFETY

- NEVER connect a portable generator to building wiring. Plug appliances directly into the generator.
- Place generators outside at least 20 feet and away from doors, windows, and vents that could allow deadly exhaust fumes to come indoors.
- Turn your generator off and let it cool down before refueling. Remember to check the oil.
- Keep the generator dry.
- Store fuel outside in labeled, approved containers.
