"Great Awakening"--(1741)

- --series of revivals, not just one
- --began several generations after arrival at Plymouth Rock (120+ yrs)
- --decline in morals & values
- --says a lot about Puritan Values by then (you don't need to be "awakened" unless you've "fallen asleep")

"Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God"

- -- possibly the most famous sermon ever preached (many times, too)
- -- 1741 (120 yrs after Puritans' arrival)
- -- 6 hours long!!
 - calm demeanor, needed to stop many times and ask for quiet
- -- What is a sermon?
 - -- a speech intended to inform, persuade, or challenge opinions

"Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God" -- speaker must capture and keep the attention of the listeners -- Persuasion through Fear

"Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God"

- -- Consider these 3 questions:
 - 1) Why would people in 1741 sit through a 6-hour sermon, without leaving?
 - 2) Would it have the same effect today?
 - 3) Is FEAR an effective motivator?

"Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God"

3 Themes:

- 1) Corrupt sinners face a fearful judgement
- 2) Time is short--God's wrath will come suddenly and unexpectedly
- 3) It is only God's mercy that extends the opportunity to repent
