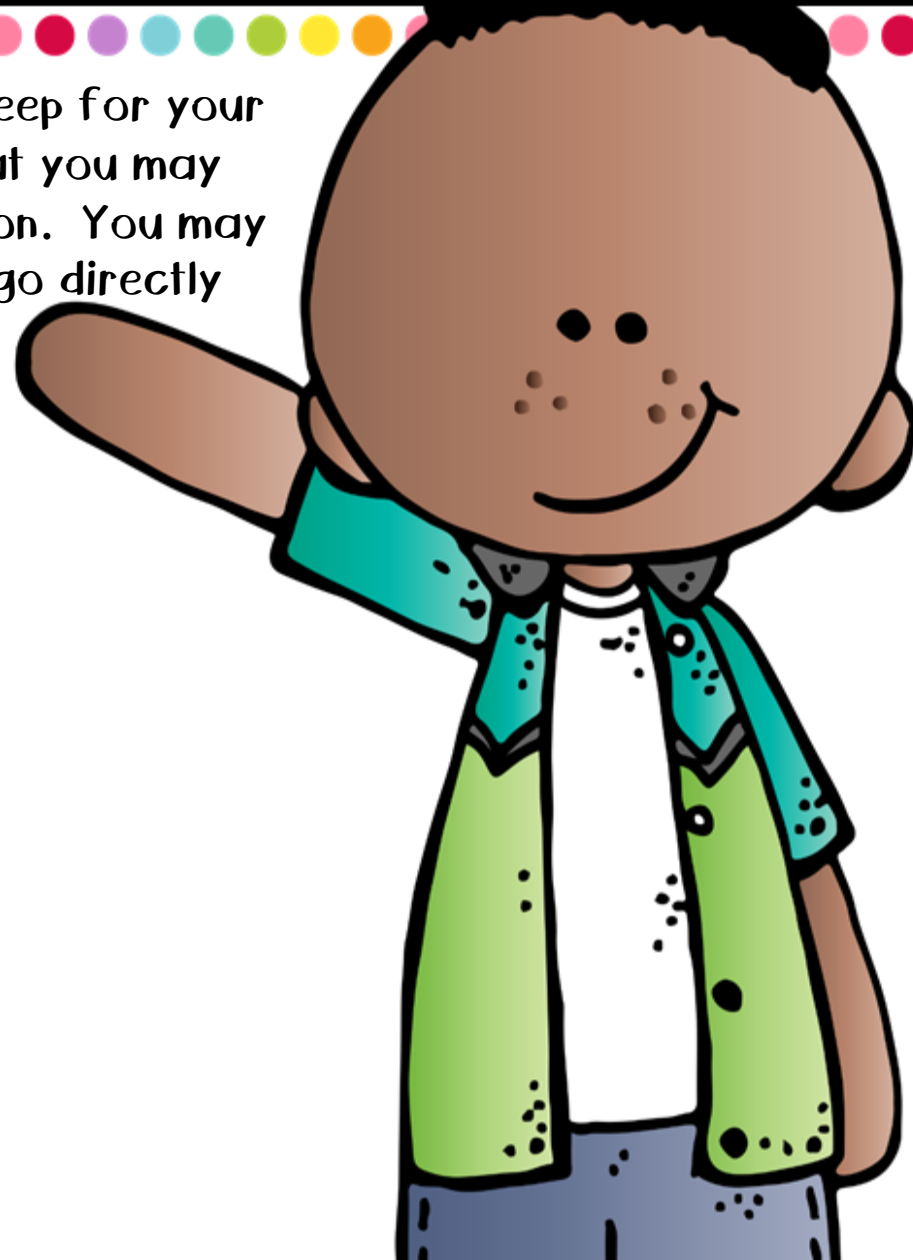

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# School Calendar

Sallee students will be following the regular school calendar for the 2020-21 school year. Grading periods will be separated into 9-week quarters. The calendar is available on our [school](#) and [district](#) websites.

## Important Dates:

First Day Grades 1-5 August 31, 2020

Teachers in grades 1-5 will be contacting each family to let them know whose classroom their child is in.

First Day Kindergarten Group 1 August 31, 2020 @ 9:30am

First Day Kinder Group 2 September 1, 2020 @ 9:30am

Kindergarten teachers will be contacting each family to let them know which day they will start. They will meet students on the bus ramp at 9:30am the first two days. Starting September 2, please remember to adhere to regular school hours and arrival procedures. Due to District safety protocols, parents will not be entering the building.



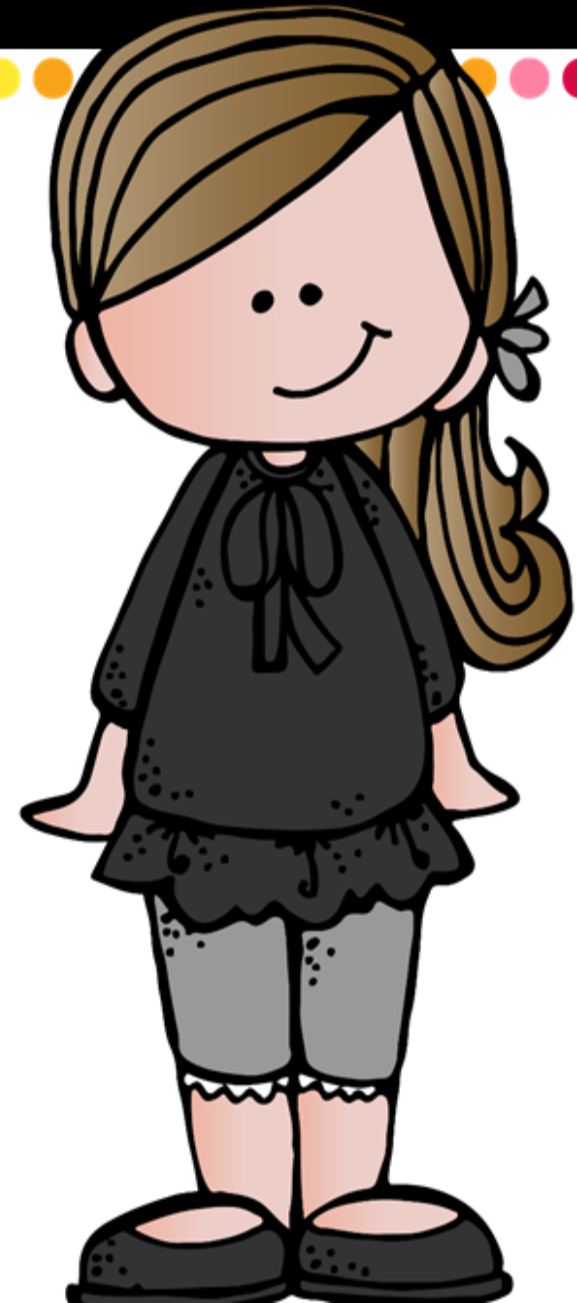
# School Times

The student school day:  
8:20am – 2:50pm

Classrooms will be open to receive students at 8:00am, so if you are not eating breakfast arrive then. If you are eating breakfast, please arrive by 7:50am in order to eat and be ready for class by 8:20am.

There is NO outside supervision before 7:50am; it is imperative that students are NOT dropped off (or arrive if walking) prior to this time. In order to social distance, please do not gather or sit on the outside benches.

Students in POUNCE and YMCA will proceed to breakfast at 7:45am to spread students out as much as possible. We have three lines and will be using the entire room for seating.



# Student Arrival

Safety Patrol leaders will supervise students walking on the sidewalk, but not open car doors this year. Please practice having your child(ren) open your car door independently.

In order to social distance and limit numbers of people on the sidewalks, plan to use the student drop-off loop. A [map indicating the traffic pattern](#) for this is located on the SJE website.

POUNCE & YMCA students may be dropped off in the bus loop only if they arrive BEFORE 7:45am. Otherwise, drop off in the regular parent line.

Late arrivals will need to park and walk into the lobby so electronic check-in can be completed.



# Student Dismissal

Student dismissal will begin promptly at 2:50pm.

When possible, make appointments after school hours to avoid missing instruction. If an after-school appointment is not possible, parents must enter the lobby to sign out their student. NO dismissals will be allowed after 2:30pm. At this point, you will need to use the parent drop-off line.

POUNCE & YMCA pick-up begins at 3:15pm unless there is an emergency.

In the event of inclement weather, parents will be notified by REMIND. Parent pick-up parents will bring their car tag up to the lobby door, so student(s) can be called. Students who walk will be held back until the weather clears. If the poor weather continues past 3:15pm parents will be called to come to the school for pick-up.



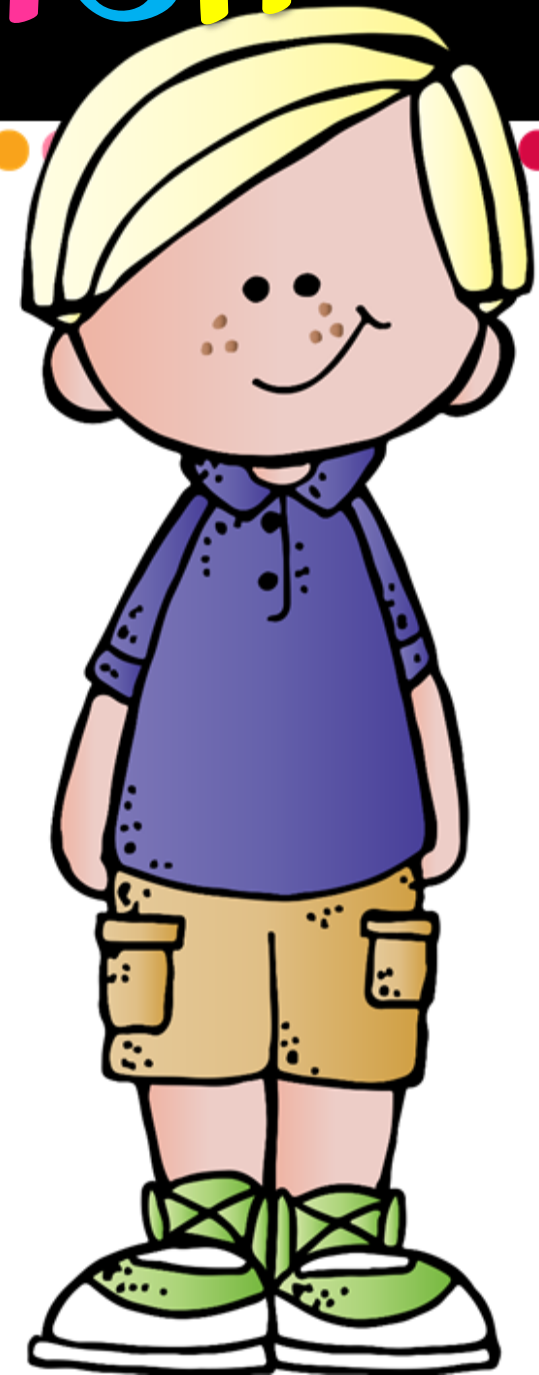
# Communication

REMIND is a District endorsed method of communication used to share classroom and building information. Some teachers choose to also use class DOJO to communicate with families. You should download the free apps to update your notification settings.

At the beginning of the year, please complete the yellow student emergency card. Notify the front office immediately with any changes throughout the year.

# Uniforms

Tops should be red, white, navy blue, or orange collared polos with no logo. Long or short sleeves are okay.

Bottoms should be navy blue or khaki pants, shorts, skirts, jumpers, or capris. Leggings may be worn under other bottoms and can be any uniform color.

Footwear should be closed-toe, rubber-soled shoes. Wear socks that are uniform colors or black.

Jackets need to be in uniform colors with no visible logos.

Accessories should not distract from learning.





# Masks/Face Coverings

In an effort to employ all possible measures for safety, employees, students, and visitors coming on our campus must wear a mask or face covering.

Masks will be required in hallways, classrooms, cafeteria, common areas, on busses, and during small group instruction. We will follow the protocol recommendations of the Department of Health, CDC, & Charlotte County School Board to the maximum extent possible with consideration given to unique circumstances. Masks do not have to be in school colors but must be in compliance with the dress code policy for CCPS outlined in the 20-21 Student Code of Conduct booklet on page 23. A link to the entire book is available on the [SJE website](#).

## What to avoid.....

- ❖ Masks or any apparel with emblems, graphics, writing, or symbols that are obscene, promote drug use, or are offensive to any specific group are not permissible.
- ❖ Masks or any apparel that disrupt learning or any school function are not permissible.
- ❖ Masks or any apparel that limit vision or cause injury are not permissible.



# More Mask Talk

Thanks to a generous donation, every student will be supplied with a mask to get the year started. Additional masks will need to be provided by the parent.

Students will be trained on [how to wear their masks](#). For example, to be the most helpful, masks should stay up over the mouth and nose without student hands touching it.

To avoid cross contamination, please print your child's name on every mask or face covering in permanent ink.

Masks will be required in the outside play areas, but may be removed with permission during times of heavy exercise or if social distanced. For example, students will wear their mask to PE and for PE instruction, but may store them on their lanyard if the activity involves heavy exercise or students are social distanced.



# all about Lunch

Again this year, breakfast and lunch will be free to all students. If you choose to send a meal with your child, please include healthy foods and beverages. Students are free to supplement packed lunches with three items from our Champ's Café. Lunchroom seats will be arranged for maximum distancing and will be sanitized after each use.

Birthdays will no longer be celebrated in the lunchroom. However, you may still send in individually-wrapped treats to share with classmates.



# Sanitation

Proper handwashing will be encouraged throughout the day. Each classroom will also be stocked with hand sanitizer, and spray disinfectant to be used as necessary.

All of the building drinking fountains will become stations to fill personal water bottles that students are encouraged to bring from home. When students arrive on campus, water bottles should hold only clear, non-caffeinated beverages.

Students may keep a 3-ounce bottle of clear hand sanitizer with them throughout the day.



# Nurse and clinic



The clinic space will provide services traditionally done by school nurses. If your child receives medication at school, it will be administered outside of the clinic. Nebulizer treatments will no longer be given at school.

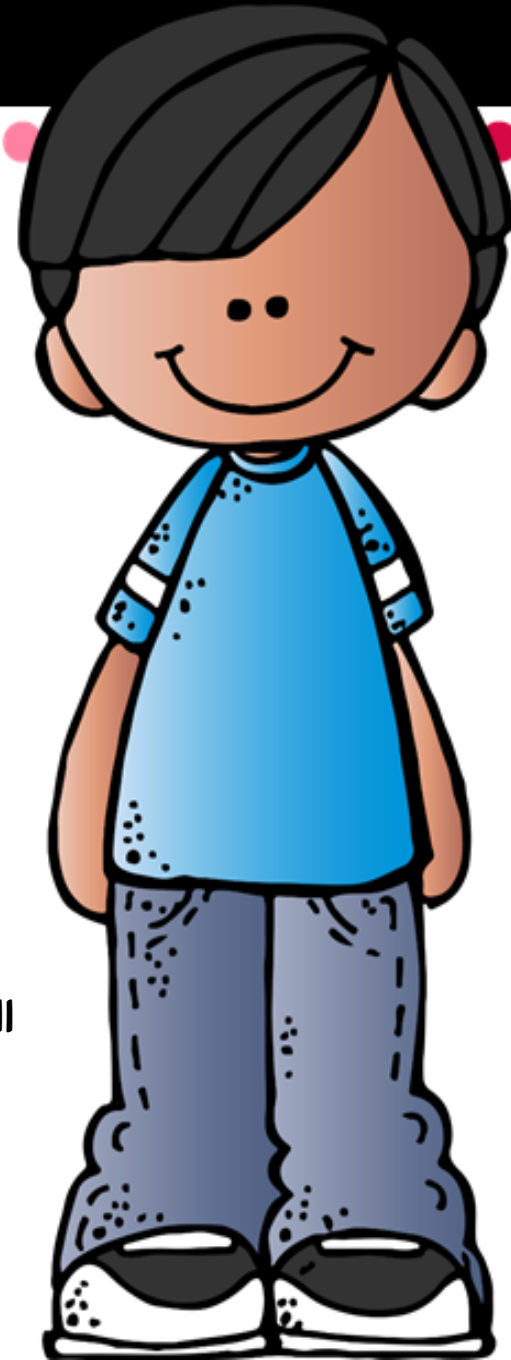
Any student feeling unwell will be referred to the school nurse/clinic. You will be notified if your child needs to be picked up from school. Please refer to the health and wellness protocols for our return-to-school policy.

# visitors

At this time, all CCPS schools are limiting visitors. On our campus:

- ❖ SAC and PTO will meet virtually for the first semester.
- ❖ Parent/Teacher conferences will be held virtually for the first semester.
- ❖ IEP/504/LEP meetings can be in-person if requested.
- ❖ Classroom volunteers, watch DOGS, or field trips will not be permitted until further notice.
- ❖ Only students and CCPS employees will be permitted to go past the lobby, including for breakfast and lunch.
- ❖ Until further notice, the Family Center and Clothes/Shoe Closet will be operated with pre-order forms only.

If the gates are closed when you come to campus, please ring the bell at the gate and be prepared to show your drivers license for identification. This process will need to be repeated at the entrance door.
