The Title 1 Family Reading Experience is an integral part of our school-wide effort to offer educational support to our families.

The atmosphere of the Family Reading Experience is friendly, fun, and informative. Families are encouraged to come and discuss their child's reading and other

areas of academic success. Your Family Associate is available to answer questions and direct families to agencies or professionals that can assist them with any current needs.

We have events in the Family Reading Experience to encourage students to visit. Parents help students locate books that are "just right" for each child's current reading level. Having books on the correct level provides the greatest opportunity for reading skills to grow. In addition to the weekly book check-out, each child receives a "keeper" book for their home library.

Myakka River's Family Reading Experience is open Mondays and Thursdays from 7:30 -8:15 a.m. Families can come before school and check out three books. Accelerated Reader Books are available, so your students can take the AR tests to achieve points for their reading goals. This time is fun and educational. Please remember that students must be accompanied by an adult.


