COURSE OVERVIEW



Literature:

Students are exposed to a wide variety of genres, including fiction, non-fiction, drama, and poetry. Students read short stories and poems from the literature book where literary elements and comprehension strategies are taught. Students will also respond to stories through writing and projects. The study of vocabulary is incorporated into the class and opportunities for essay and creative writing are provided. Technology is used for research and publishing of projects.

English:

This course will encompass the study of language skills and writing. The grammar section will continue the development of skills in grammar, usage, and mechanics. Students will enhance their writing skills by developing correct sentence structure, building paragraphs, and writing. Students will also research, write, and present to fellow classmates.

Quizzes

- Pop quizzes and announced quizzes will cover what is being taught in class.
- Vocabulary and spelling tests are given on Friday unless students are told otherwise.

*Please check your child's grades through FOCUS on a weekly/bi-weekly basis. Please have them check in with me if they have questions or concerns.

- 1. 1st Warning: the teacher provides a verbal reprimand/reminder to student.
- 2. **2nd Warning**: the teacher will conference (privately) with the student and review classroom/school-wide expectations.
- 3. 3rd Warning: the teacher will contact the office if behavior is hindering the learning of themselves or other students. Students may be removed from the classroom.
- 4. **Repeated behavior concerns:** the teacher will contact parent to discuss behavior and collaborate to find solutions.
- ***Referral to Administration: a student will be immediately referred to administration for severe/repeated behavior problems.***
- *Students are expected to follow the classroom/school behavior expectations as well as the Student Code of Conduct.

REMIND APP and EMail

I utilize both Remind and email for communication. The REMIND system preloads based on FOCUS contact information. If you need to connect with your child's class, please contact the teacher via email or a note.

TARDIES

Students are expected to be in the classroom at the start of class. If students are not in the class when the bell rings they will be marked tardy.

CELL PHONES/TECHNOLOGY

Electronic devices MUST be turned off, stored OUT OF SIGHT, and in backpacks before students enter first period. They must remain in the backpacks for the remainder of the day and are not to be used during class. For privacy issues no photos are to be taken.

RESTROOMS

Students are permitted to use the restroom between classes; however, it is the student's' responsibility to be on time and prepared for class. Restroom breaks during class will occur only in the first 10 minutes (unless it is an emergency with teacher approval). Students will need to sign out and in for restroom breaks and take the pass.
