

ADMISSION OF NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

Non-resident families who wish to enroll children in the school system shall submit a request in writing to the Superintendent who shall determine whether or not the student(s) will be admitted. The Superintendent will also determine which building the student will attend.

Non-resident families must provide their own transportation.

Tuition for the attendance of non-resident students, recommended by the Superintendent of Schools and approved by the Board of Education, shall be determined by using the formula established by the Commissioner of Education.

Special consideration may be given to a six grade student who becomes a non-resident in the last 5 months or less of the school term, and has previously been a student for 3 consecutive years. A Guardian may request in writing that the Superintendent of Schools waive tuition. Upon the discretion of the Superintendent of Schools, a waiver may be granted.
