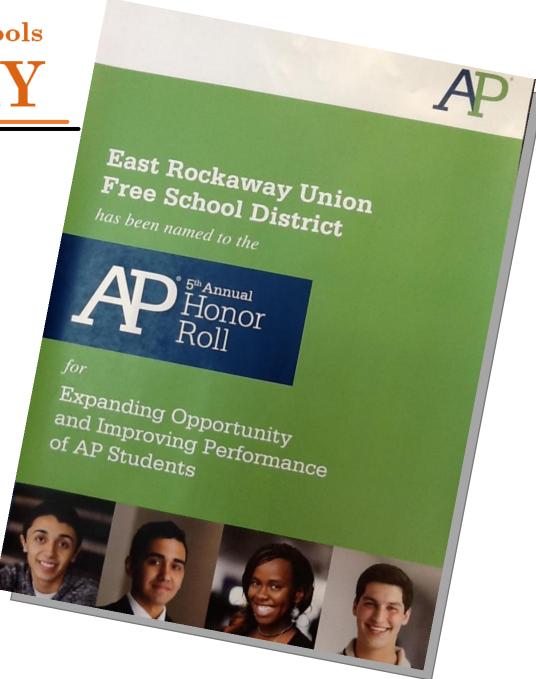

ESL enrollment look back 5 years: 2010-2011 = 16 2011-2012 = 16 2012-2013 = 15 2013-2014 = 222014-2015 = 25

New requirements (mandates) necessitate the addition of two (2) staff members to address:

- 5 Proficiency Levels
- Mandated Co-teaching
- 2 year age span reduction

2015-2016 Proposed Budget Tax Levy Cap

 Allowable Tax Levy Growth Factor (CPI Increase) Forecasted at 1.6 – 1.8% (Under 2%)

Actual CPI was finalized at 1.62%

After allowable exclusions and other adjustments allowed under the tax levy cap provisions:

• Approximate Levy increase off \$450,000 (Slightly less than last year) *State Aid report indicating forecasted building aid is needed to finalize this calculation!

OSC – Fiscal Stress Monitoring Report

The Fiscal Monitoring Report is part of a state wide initiative launched by the Comptrollers Office last year and uses an elaborate formula to calculate a fiscal stress score for each school district

- 1. No Designation / Not in Fiscal Stress
- 2. Susceptible to Fiscal Stress
- 3. Moderate Fiscal Stress
- 4. Significant Fiscal Stress

East Rockaway UFSD:

 $16.7\% \rightarrow 53.3\% = Moderate Fiscal Stress$
