Universal PreK

- Universal Pre-Kindergarten is a New York State early childhood initiative focused on the educational development of 4 year olds.
- The program promotes the development of children's language, early literacy skills, cognitive, physical, social and educational skills.
- Children will meet or exceed the criteria established for their age, be ready to learn and be inquisitive, and be successful as they transition to the kindergarten environment.
- By June, children are ready for Kindergarten!







- Our program is run by **Scope Education Services**, through an RFP Process
- Children must be 4 years of age prior to December 1, to be eligible to participate.
- The program is funded by a New York State Department of Education grant
- Students are selected through a lottery in the spring
- Two classes of 18 students each
- We receive funding for 26 students and the district provides funding for 4 students
- Six spots are available for self pay by parents to Scope directly.
- All placements in the program are contingent upon the reauthorization of the Universal Pre-Kindergorten grant





- Programs are in session Monday through Friday
- One teacher and one teacher assistant
- Five Hour Instructional Program 9 AM -2 PM
- Lunch Provided to All Students
- Two snacks provided by SCOPE
- 180 Days per Year

- Curriculum based on the NYS Learning Standards for pre-school age children
- A balance of academic and social learning
- Music, movement, purposeful play and hands on activities integrated throughout the day
- Instruction delivered in individual, small and large groups
- Teacher and child guided instruction
- Differentiated learning styles for all children

Readiness for Kindergarten

The UPK program enhances a child's readiness skills to support a smooth transition into Kindergarten classrooms.
