What is Cooperative Learning?

- Most of the cooperative activities involve problem solving, critical thinking, and creativity. There are many ways to be successful when participating in a cooperative activity.

Branches from the Cooperation Tree

- **Cooperation-** The act of working together to achieve a common goal.
- Communication-The exchange of thoughts, opinions, and information by the use of speech or body language.
- **Responsibility-** A particular assignment or obligation that must be carried out.
- **Honesty-** Being truthful with yourself and others.
- **Trust-** To have confidence and believe in a person or thing.
- **Leadership-** The ability to guide in direction, course, action, opinion.
- Acceptance- To have the ability to bring a person into your group recognizing their strengths and weaknesses with a sense of approval.
- **Sharing-** The act of giving and receiving, or to have something at the same time as someone else.
- **Kindness-** The quality of being friendly, generous, and considerate.

General Unit Vocabulary

- Strategy- A plan or method which is created for achieving a particular goal.
- **Verbal Communication-** Being able to share thoughts and ideas through talking and the use of speech.
- **Non-Verbal Communication-** This form of communication involves **no** use of speech, but focuses on facial expressions, gestures, and "body language"
- Rely- To depend on someone or something with full trust and confidence.
- Criticize- To find fault or judge unfavorably.
