





Thinking Maps Update

- Applying Thinking Maps in the classroom















Restructured Literacy Block

- Increased time for students engaged in the work
- Gradual release of responsibility










Restructured Literacy Block

 Key to the literacy block is the new "Launching" unit of our elementary ELA curriculum with four essential questions that are common to all grade levels

□What does it mean to be part of a reading community?
□How does a reading workshop go?
□What habits do good readers have?
□What does it mean to think as I read?

Literacy from a Student's Perspective










Roadmap of Literacy Coach's Work – Year 1

- Effectively merge our Wonders program with our Balanced Literacy Framework through new Units of Study
- Align reading, writing, and content areas for more comprehensive and cohesive learning opportunities
- Put student data at the forefront of curricular and instructional planning decisions at the district, building, classroom, and individual student levels













Details of Coach's Work

- Data analysis meetings and goal setting with teachers and principals
- Design and construction of new Units of Study K-6
- Model lessons in classrooms
- Cyclical review of effectiveness of Units of Study
- Cyclical review of effectiveness of new Literacy Block structure
- Professional development workshops





Benefits for Teachers

- Professional development workshops
 - **FUNdations** relaunch
 - Vocabulary development
 - Supporting phonemic awareness
 - Implementing Geodes decodable readers
- Concrete supports
 - Leveled libraries, including takehome kits for families
 - Purchase of novel sets
 - Lending bookrooms and set-up for Geodes kits

The Road Ahead

- Rollout of i-Ready as our universal screener and instructional support tool
- Incorporating PBL into our 5th and 6th grade classrooms
- Introducing the RULER program to students in support of socialemotional learning
- Employing a 6-day cycle to expand opportunities for "specials" and increase flexibility for student support
- Shifting focus of coach from curriculum to instruction
