Mental Health:

We recently received information from the City of Ellensburg about a free training that is available in our community.

Comprehensive Healthcare is offering a free, virtual Suicide Awareness For Everyone (SAFE) Training on September 22 at 3:30 p.m., and the facilitators are Regina Myers and Morgan Grant. This is a 90-minute training, designed to empower individuals to intervene when someone is experiencing thoughts of suicide, and dispel common myths regarding suicide and mental health. SAFE training covers topics like:

- Behavioral health implications of the COVID-19 pandemic
- Suicide statistics
- Suicide prevention and wellness
- How to help someone experiencing thoughts of harming themselves, and what to do in the event of a behavioral health crisis.
