About the Program:

The *Alutant* Student Newspaper is an ASB-funded program that is open to all EHS students. While most reporters take the Journalism class, anyone has the ability to write for the *Alutant* through our freelance program.

Why Would I Want to do This?

There are so many reasons - why would you not?

What do I Write?

- Feature articles about clubs or campus groups
- Editorials that argue clearly about a newsworthy item.
- And other options as well!

How Does this Work?

Submit your article at any time following the guidelines on the back of this sheet. While we can't guarantee publication, we'll do our best to make room for the article in the next issue.

Article Requirements:

Article format: Your article should have a headline, byline with your name, and run from 100 to 800 words, depending on content of article. Please include your contact information on the submission should there be any questions.

Photography: Please include 2 or more original photos with your submission.

Editing: We ask that all articles follow standard AP style as closely as possible. We will help you with this if requested. Articles will be edited for accuracy and format before publication.

Conflicts of Interest: It is best to not write about any group you are directly a part of or to interview any person you are a close friend to. We may reject any article that shows too strong of a bias.

Libel, **plagiarism and accuracy**: All work submitted must be the original work of the author and be based on the most accurate reporting possible.

Editing, cutting, and rejecting: Articles may be cut down and will be edited for publication. We reserve the right to reject articles for room or editorial discretion. We cannot guarantee publication of submissions.
