

## Current 8<sup>th</sup> Grader Credit / Registration Information

It is time to plan for registration. A few things to consider when you register: **You will be auto scheduled through the Skyward system with the classes you request in registration.** Make sure you register for the correct SIX courses. You will be held to these choices. Ensure you also select alternates to your first choices to get the classes you want. Otherwise counselors will fill schedules with what is available.

**Registration will be open through Skyward Family Access March 8th-12th.**

There are certain requirements that each 9<sup>th</sup> grade student should take in order to stay on track for graduation. **It is your responsibility to make sure you are on track for graduation.** These requirements are as follows:

- 1 year Freshman English OR Freshman English Honors
- 1 year Math
- 1 year Science (Systems of the Earth OR Agricultural Science)
- 1 semester of Career Choices **AND** 1 semester of Health
- 2 Other required courses or electives - Fitness, Career & Technical Education (CTE), Art/Music, World Language, etc.

Your counselor will update your schedule accordingly if courses are missing.

It is never too soon to begin planning for college. Keep in mind that in order to attend most four year colleges or universities, you will need to complete a “core” of classes by the time you graduate from high school. These classes mirror our high school graduation requirements with a few exceptions. These classes include:

### College Core

4 years English  
3 years Math (including Alg II)  
2 years lab Science (including chemistry or physics)  
3 years History/Social Studies  
2 years World Language  
1 year Fine or Performing Arts  
Quantitative Course senior year

### EHS Graduation Requirements

4 years English  
3 years Math  
3 years Science  
3 years History/Social Studies  
2 years PE  
2 years Art (fine and/or performing arts) (1 may be Personal Pathway)  
1 year Career & Technical Education  
1 semester Health  
1 semester Consumer and Family Issues  
2 years of World Language or Personal Pathway  
3 credits of Electives  
Washington State History curriculum  
Successful completion of all required state testing  
High School and Beyond Plan, including Job Shadow and Community Service
