

Superintendent's Revised Recommendations, December 2010:

Proposed School Consolidation

Close 5 elementary schools. No change to middle or high school boundaries.

SHELDON REGION

Close Coburg Elementary in 2011. New neighborhood elementary school would be Gilham. No change in neighborhood middle school, Cal Young.


Gilham capacity estimate: 563–621 (27/class)


2011 enrollment projection: 490 Gilham + 99 Coburg = 589 combined (fewer students from Coburg if charter school approved)

Close Meadowlark Elementary in 2011. New neighborhood elementary school would be Willagillespie. No change in middle school boundary — students in former Meadowlark neighborhood still would attend Monroe, and students in former Willagillespie neighborhood still would attend Cal Young. The Willamette Gardens island would change from Willagillespie to the Holt neighborhood which surrounds it.

Willagillespie capacity estimate: 482–567 (27/class)

2011 enrollment projection: 318 Willagillespie + 187 Meadowlark = 505 combined







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CHURCHILL REGION


Close Crest Drive Elementary in 2011. New neighborhood elementary school would be Adams. No change in neighborhood middle schools — as now, students from combined Crest Drive/Adams neighborhood still mostly would attend Arts & Technology Academy, with smaller areas feeding into Roosevelt and Spencer Butte.

Adams capacity estimate: 374-459 (27/class)

2011 enrollment projection: 188 Adams + 268 Crest Drive = 456 combined if all 150+ current transfer students chose to attend

Close Twin Oaks Elementary in 2012. New neighborhood elementary school would be McCornack. No change in middle school boundary — students in combined McCornack/Twin Oaks neighborhood still would attend Kennedy. McCornack would need to be expanded, as the school does not currently have room for all Twin Oaks students.


McCornack current capacity estimate: 401–486 (27/class) **2011 enrollment projection:** 376 McCornack + 206 Twin Oaks = 582



The K-8 Arts & Technology Academy blends a neighborhood boundary at the 6th–8th grades with a neighborhood-priority alternative program for K-5th arade.



Family School, an alternative K-8 program with no neighborhood boundary, is co-located with Arts & Technology Academy.



SOUTH REGION

Close Parker Elementary in 2011. Neighborhood divided between Edgewood and Camas Ridge. No change in middle school boundary — students from former Parker neighborhood still would attend Spencer Butte, and students from former Camas Ridge neighborhood still would attend Roosevelt.

Edgewood capacity estimate: 428–486 (27/class)


2011 enrollment projection: 304 from Edgewood + 156 from Parker = 460 combined

Camas Ridge capacity estimate: 320-405 (27/class)

2011 enrollment projection: 291 from Camas Ridge + 100 from Parker = 391 combined

Move Charlemagne to the Parker building; close the Fox Hollow site.

Charlemagne's K-5 program has fewer than 300 students. If moved, it would share the larger and more centrally located Parker building with some special education programs.





Charlemagne is an alternative school with no neighborhood boundary, but many students continue the French immersion program at Roosevelt.
