



C Hall hours after the fire was extinguished. Fire fighters had to chop through the roof to get to the fire source. The art showcase on the left still protects priceless student art.



Looking down B Hall toward the entrance. The water used to put out the fire caused considerable damage to the floors as well as the D Hall gym floor.





The above pictures show what the fire did to the C-Hall classrooms. The destruction was incredible and the clean-up lasted several weeks.




1985-1986

#### REPS./ PARTIES








The house made many goals for the year. They organized a school social activity, and a day trip to the coast, as well as a pizza/movie party, and a bowling day.






