

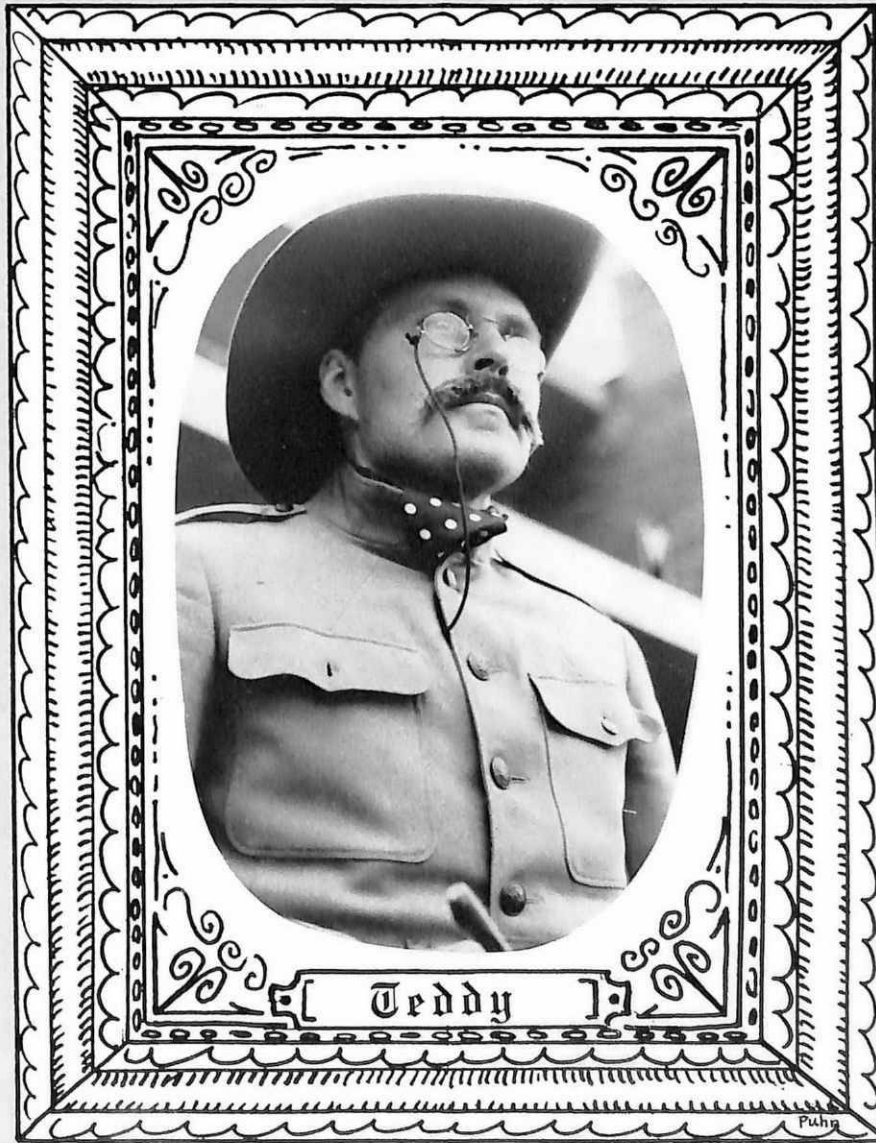

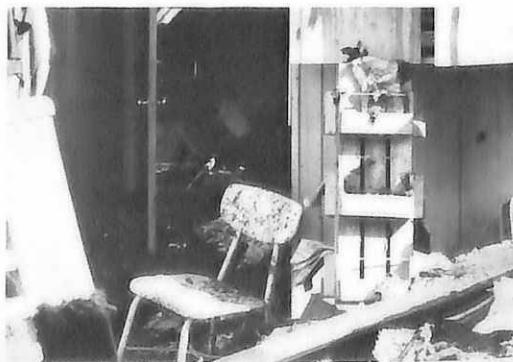
C Hall hours after the fire was extinguished. Fire fighters had to chop through the roof to get to the fire source. The art showcase on the left still protects priceless student art.



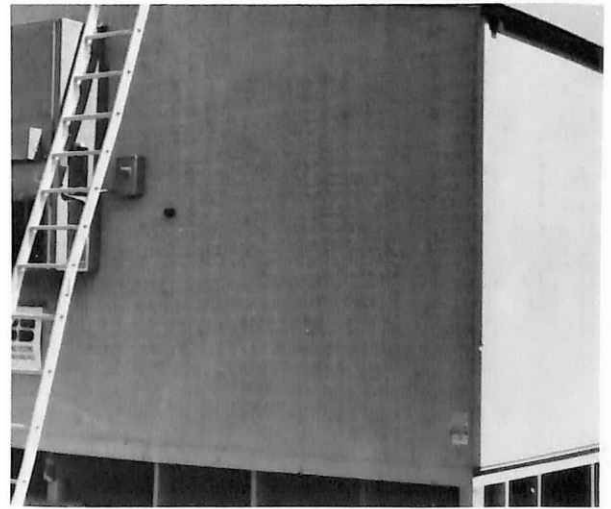
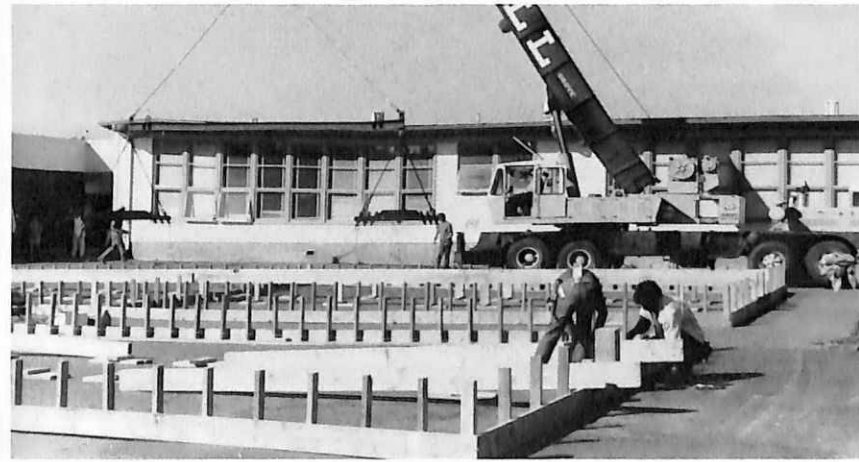
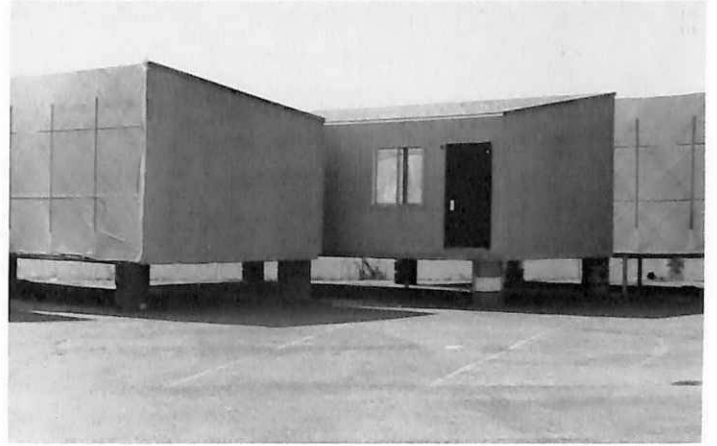
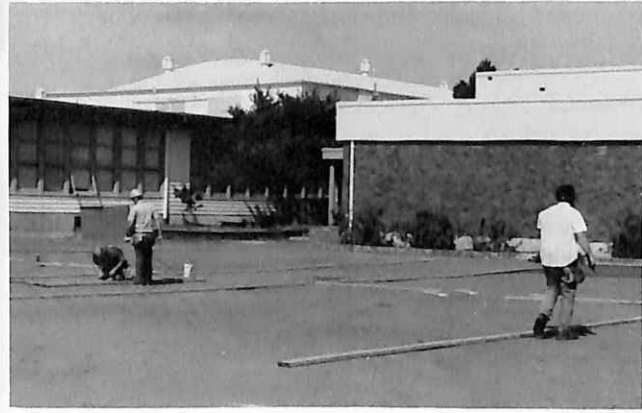
The above pictures show what the fire did to the C-Hall classrooms. The destruction was incredible and the clean-up lasted several weeks.

The Rebuilding- "BULLY"

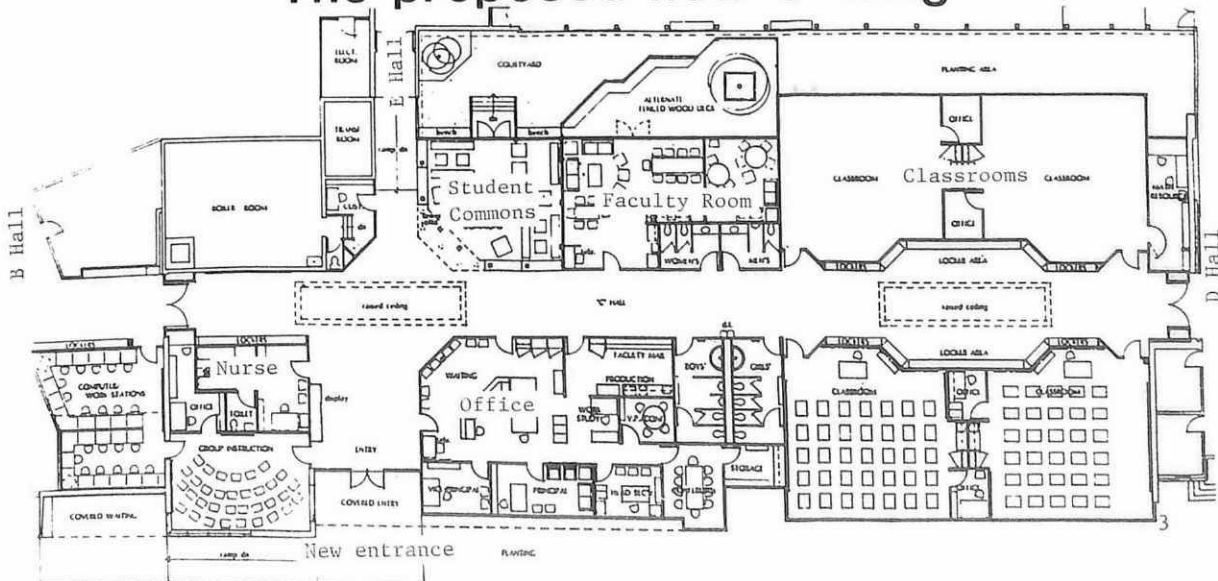

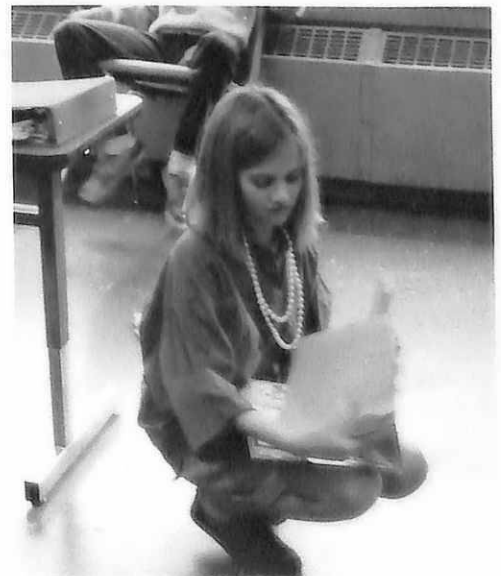

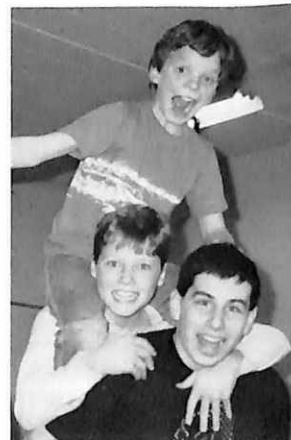

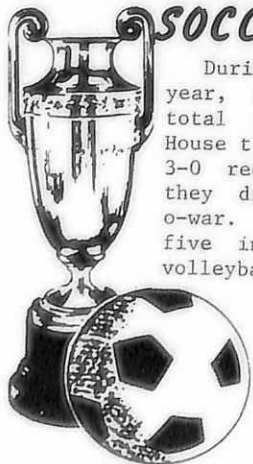

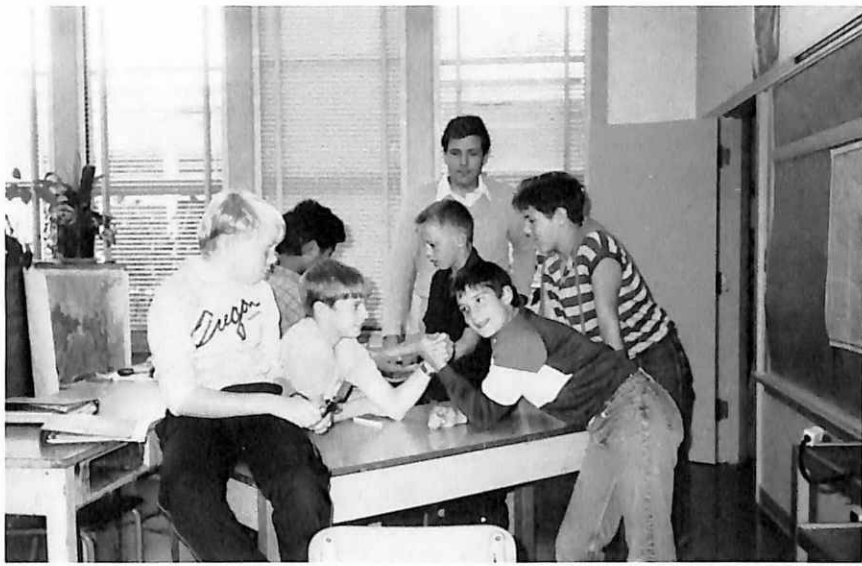

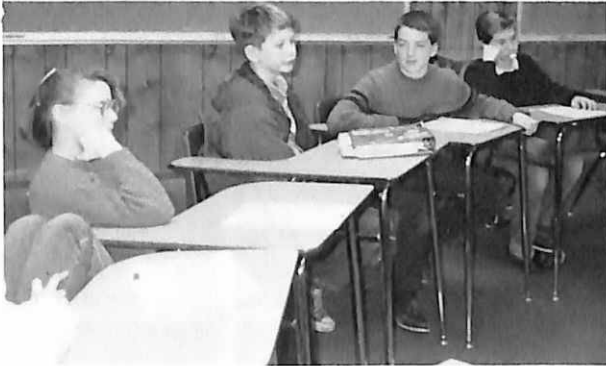

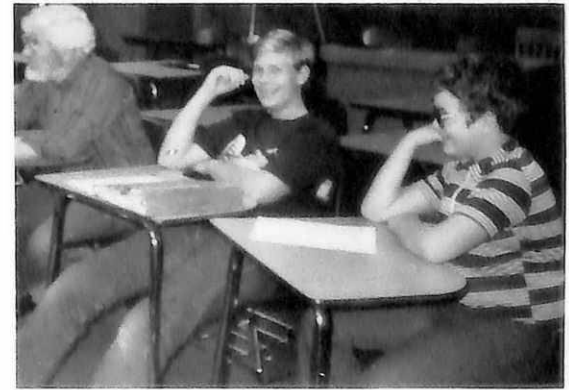


House History

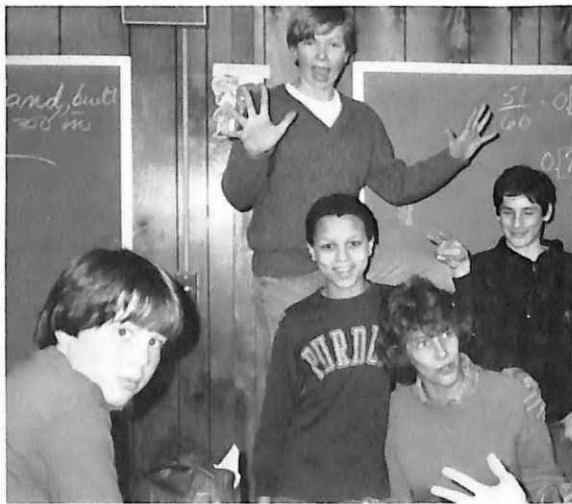

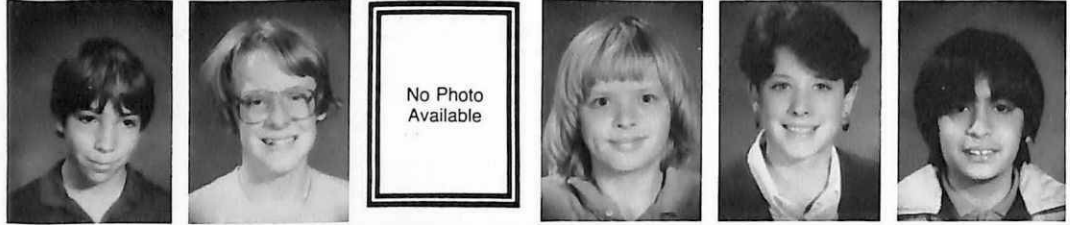

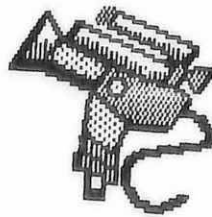

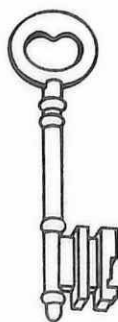

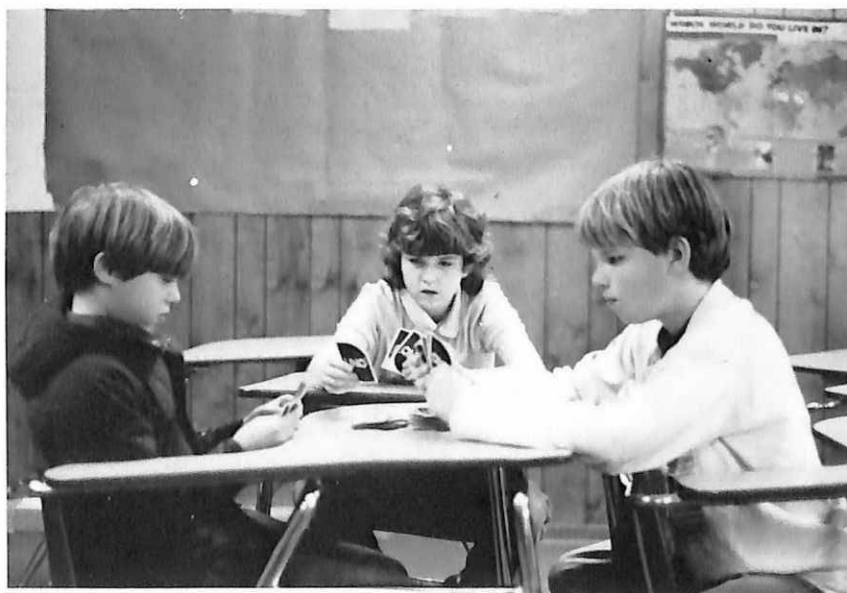

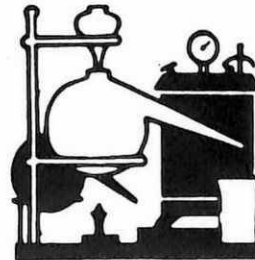


MAFIT'S MANIACS: THE YEAR IN REVIEW

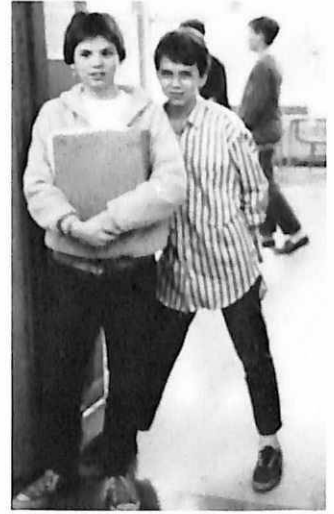

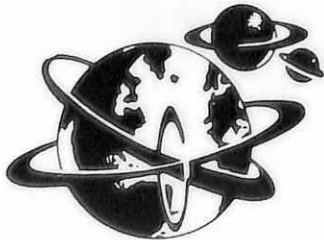

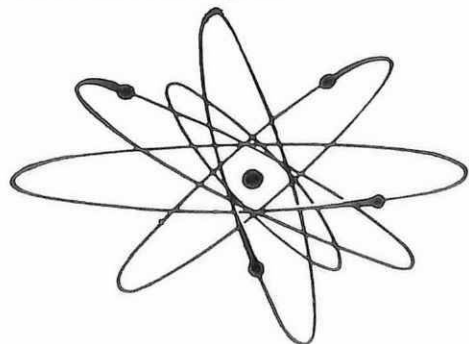
House History

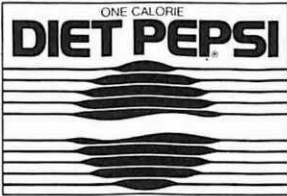

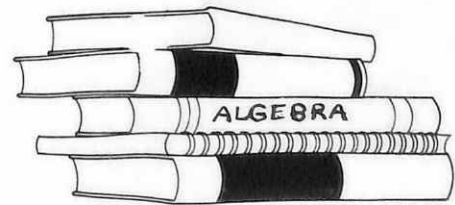


The House motto "2-P or not 2-P" comes from the room where the House meets portable-2 or 2-P.

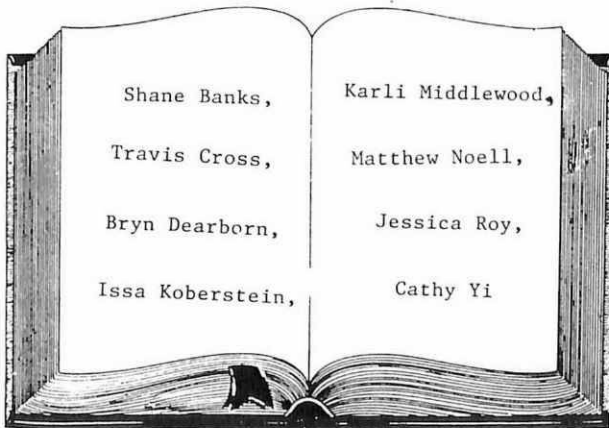

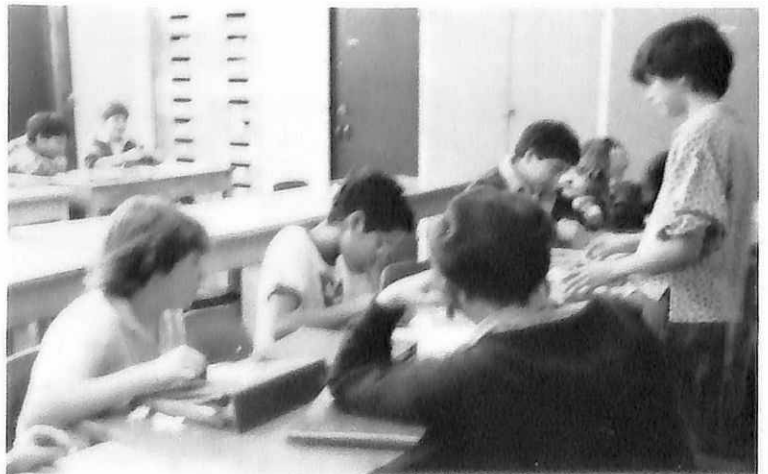
