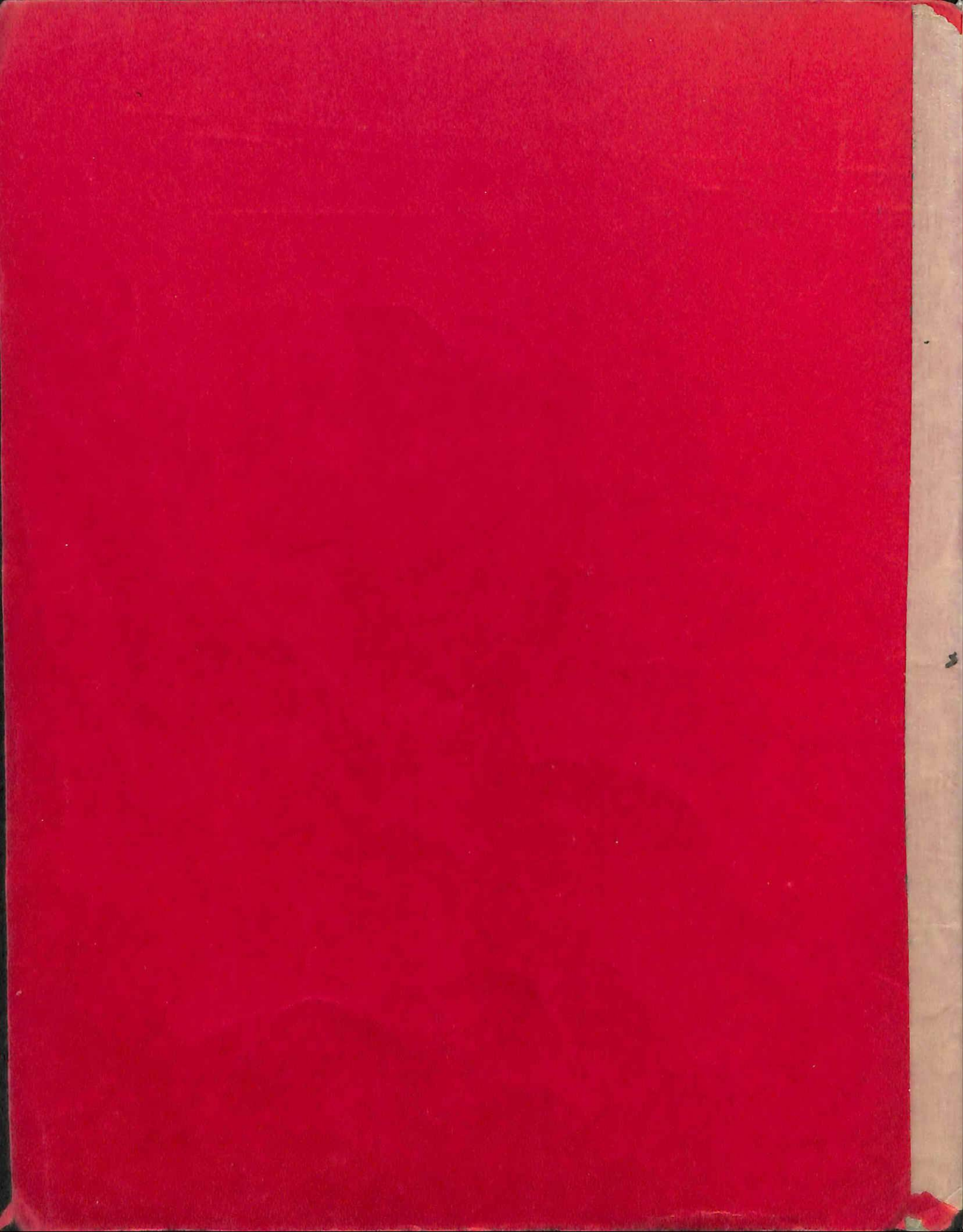

# Travel through time...



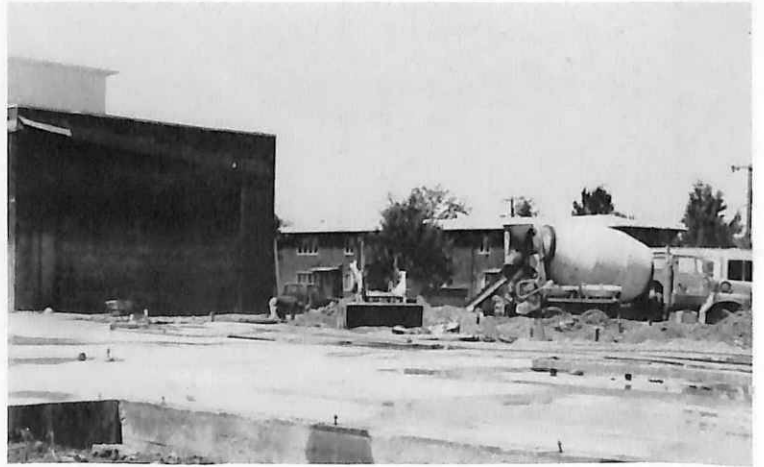
This was Roosevelt before the fire. The fire started on August 10th, 1985 at an early morning hour.



After the fire on August 10th, 1985, C-hall was in bad shape, but after 6 months of rebuilding, it is back and better than ever.



During construction, a sign was put up in front of B-hall with the names of the General Contractor, Mechanical Contractor, Electrical Contractor, Structural Engineer, and the Mechanical and Electrical Engineers.



A bulldozer and a cement mixer work on the foundation in which C-hall was built upon. Seventeen months after arsonists destroyed the original C-hall students moved into the new C-hall.

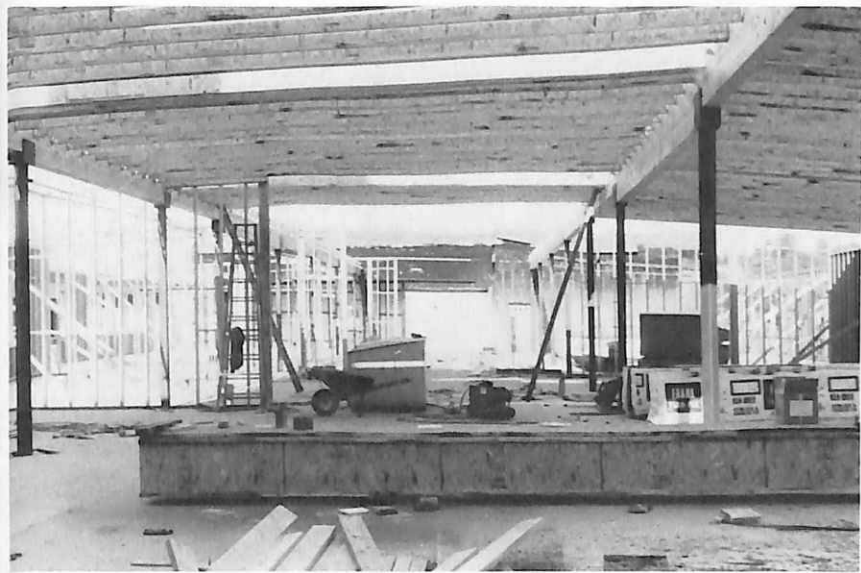


The construction company busies itself with reconstruction. During the mid-reconstruction period, all kinds of vehicles were coming in and going out during the day.

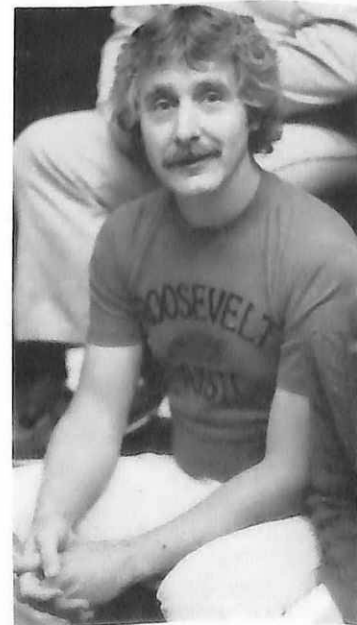

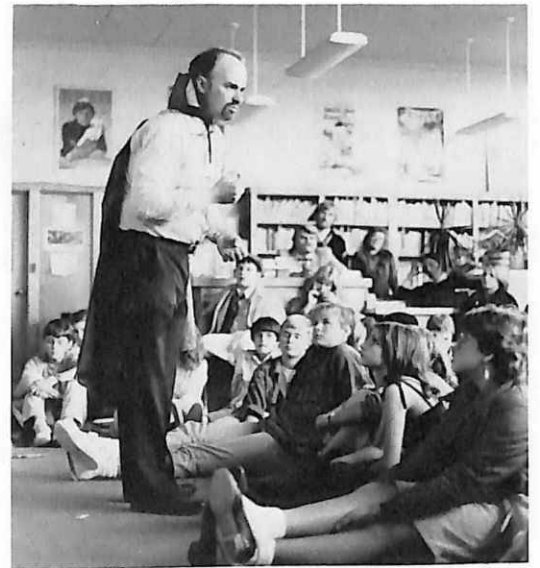

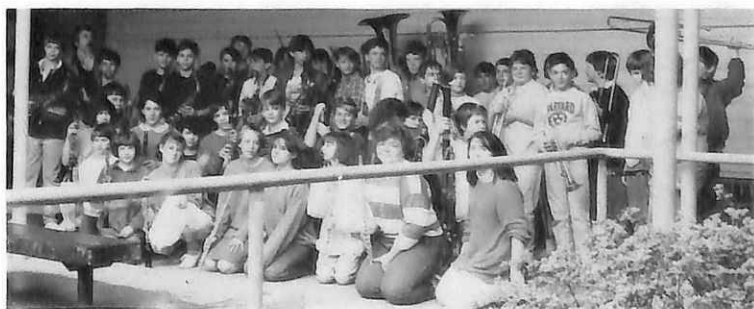

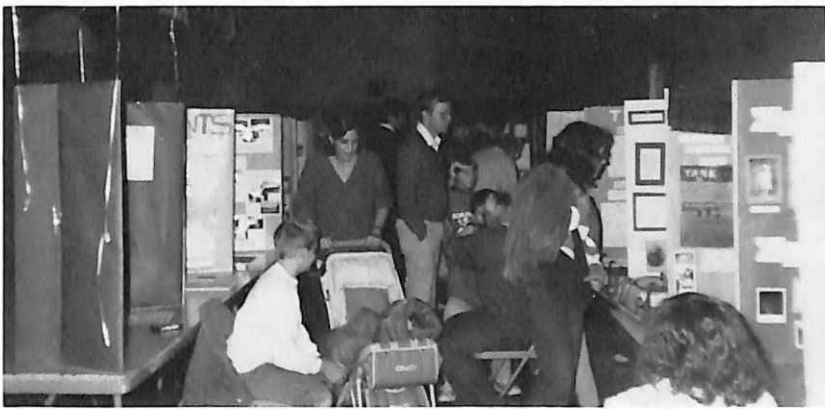

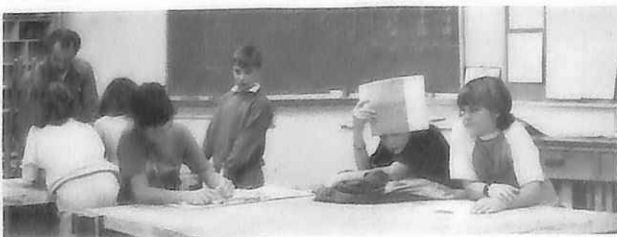

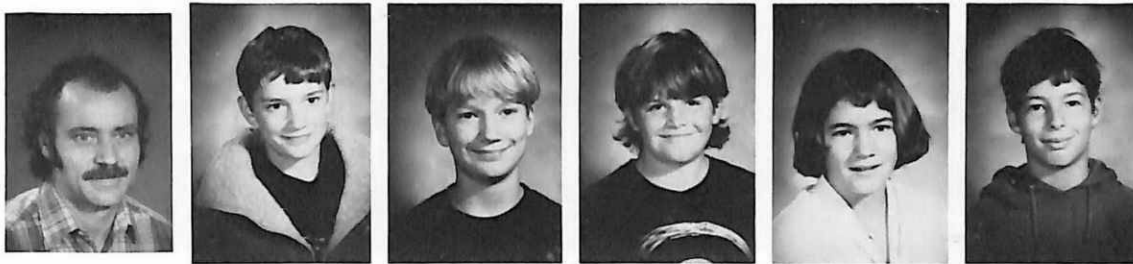

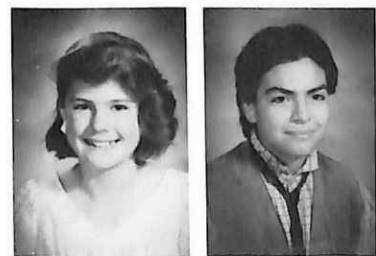

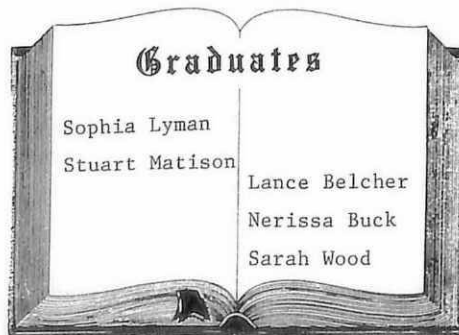

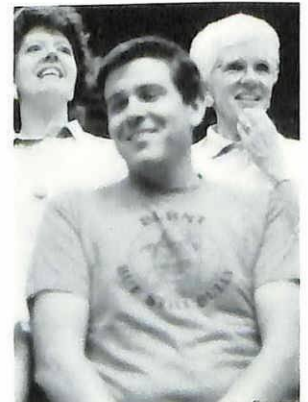

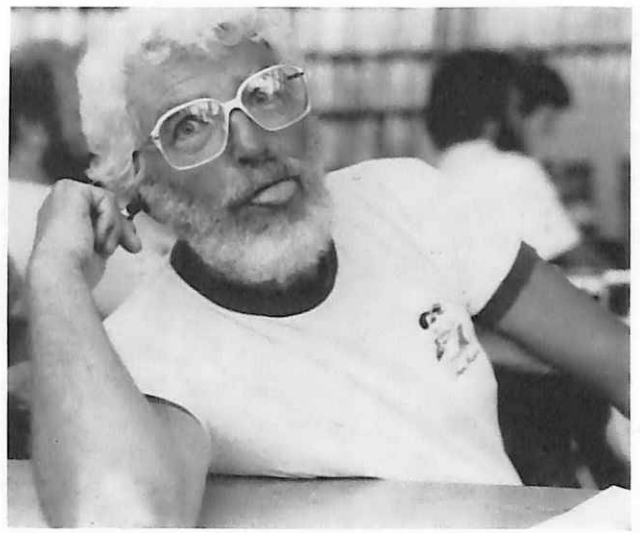

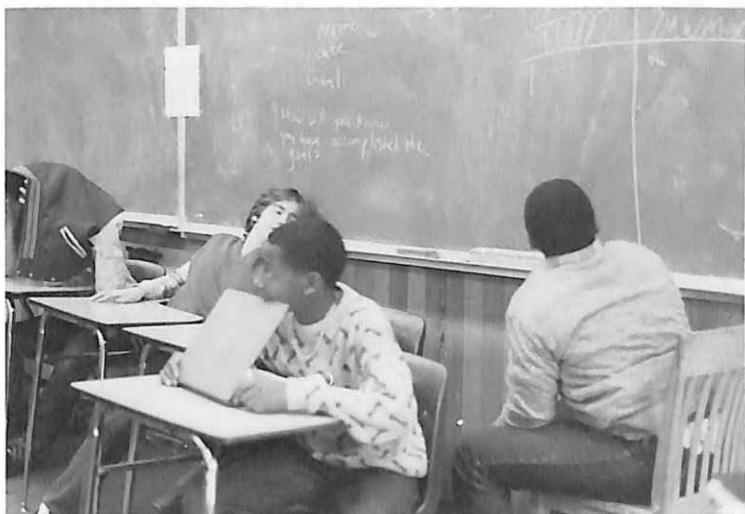

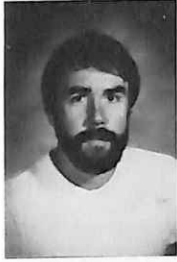

Finally, we say goodbye to all the eighth graders and other departing students. Farewell!



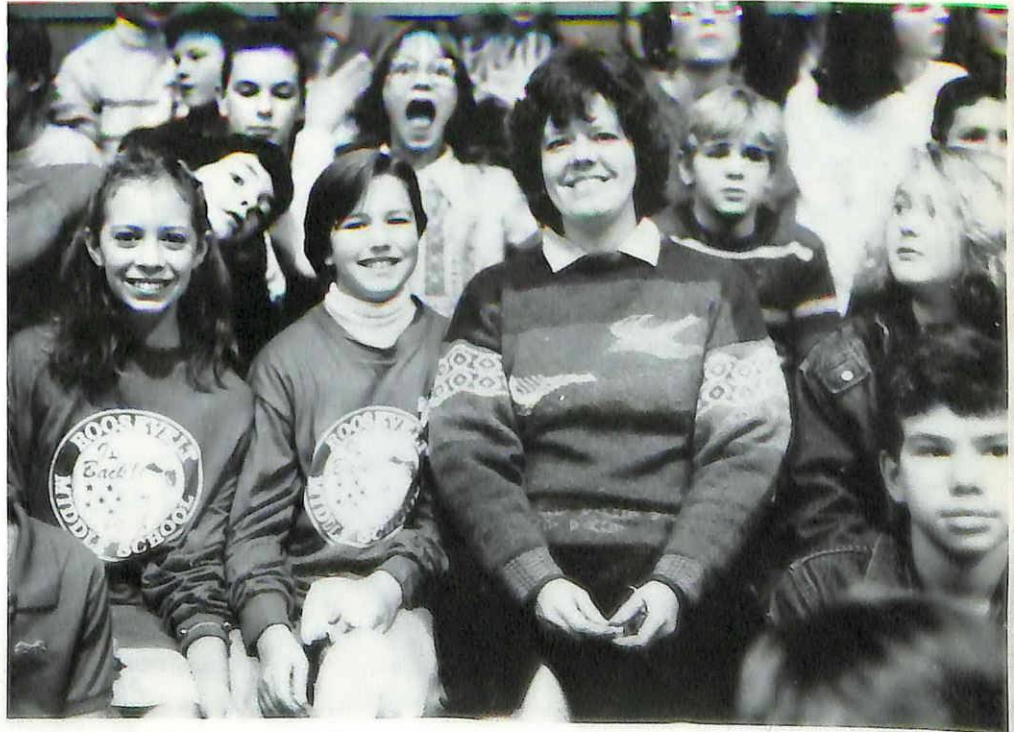

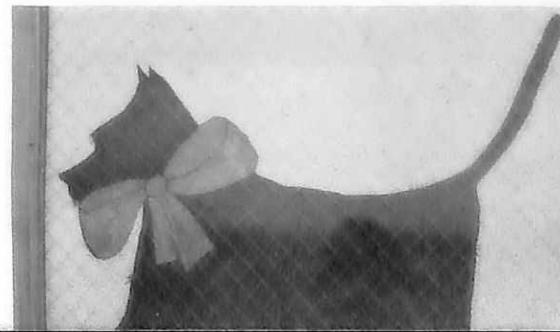

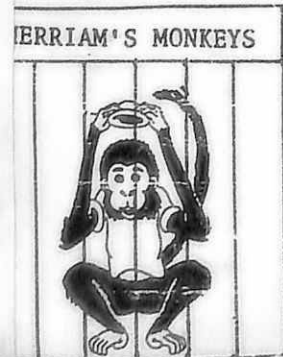

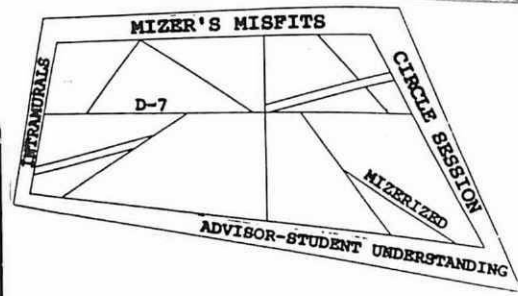

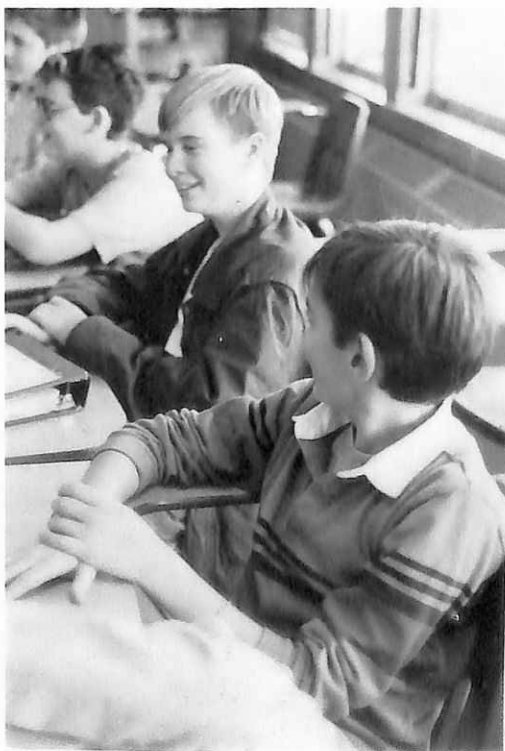

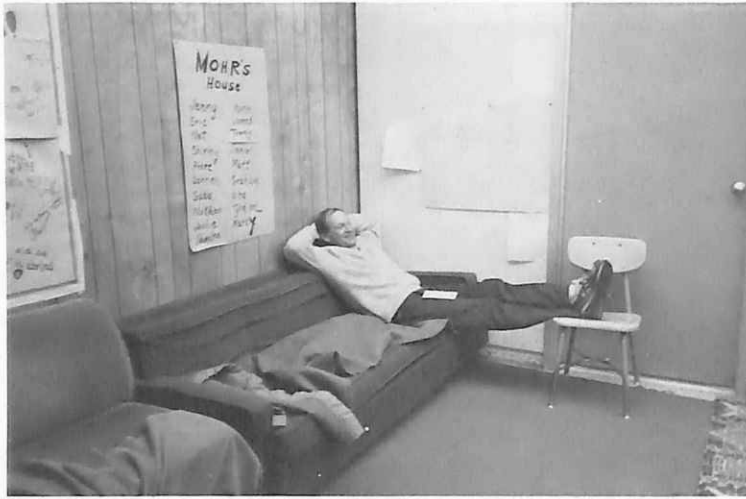

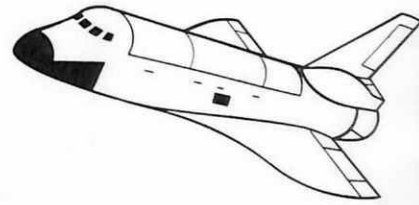

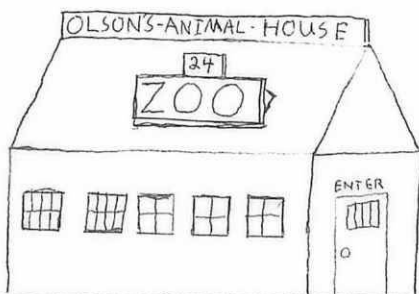

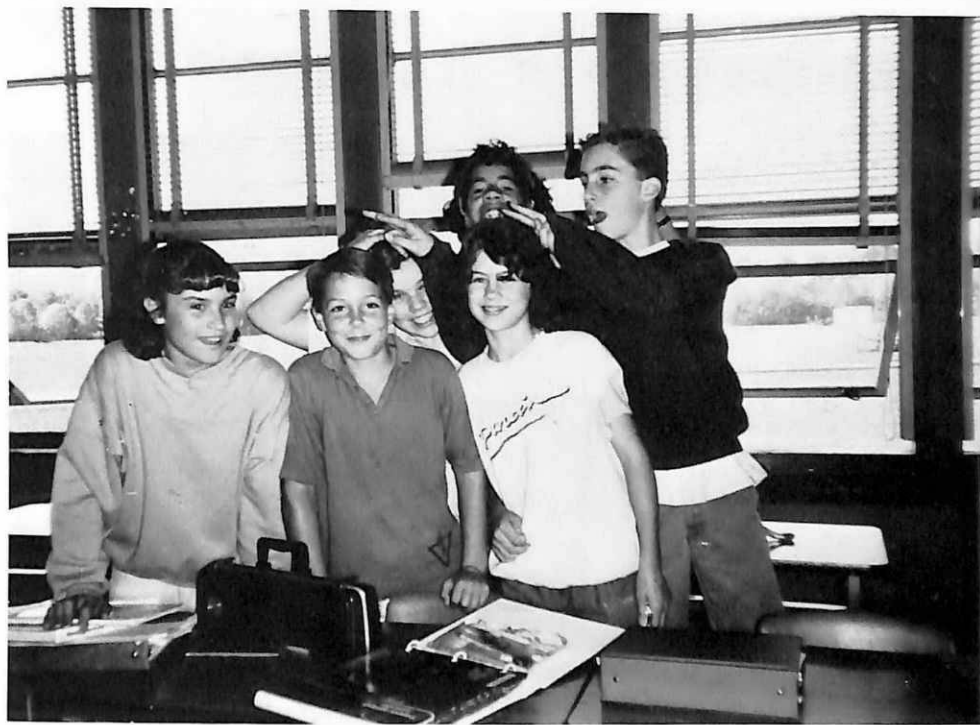

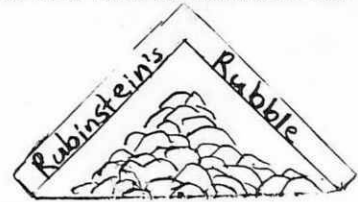

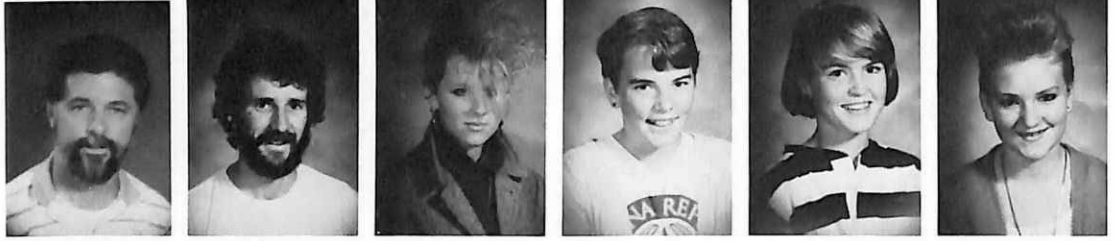

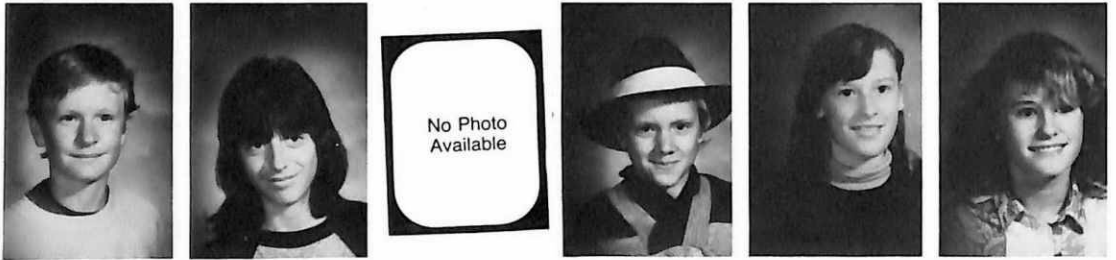

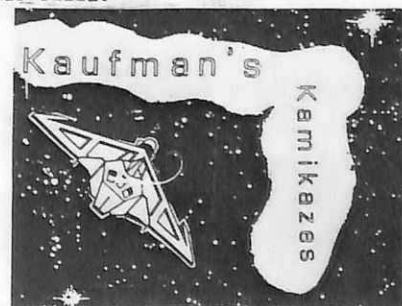

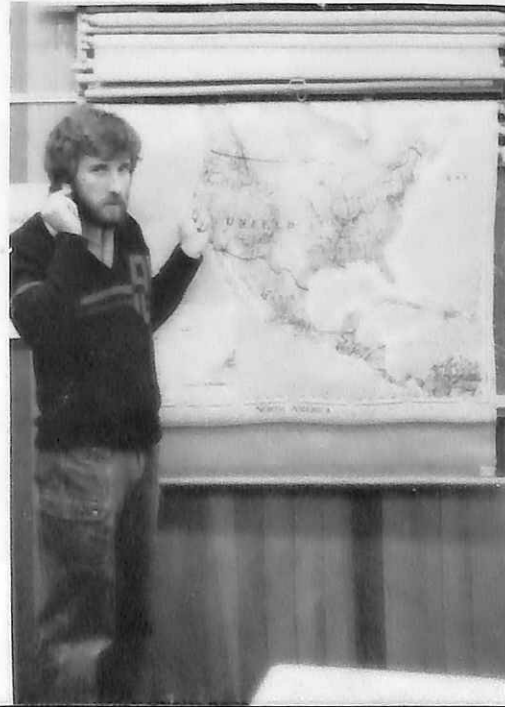

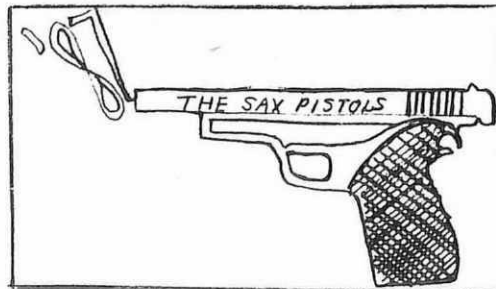

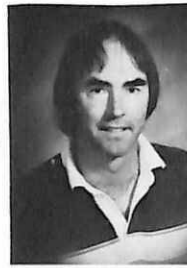

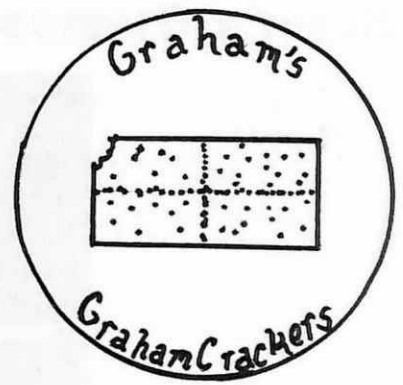

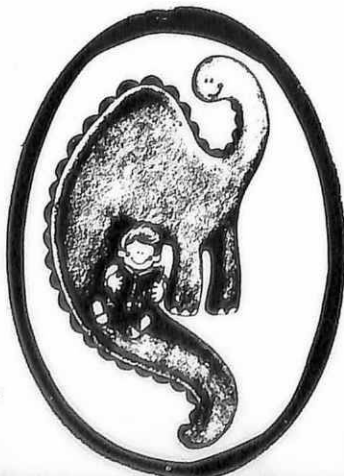

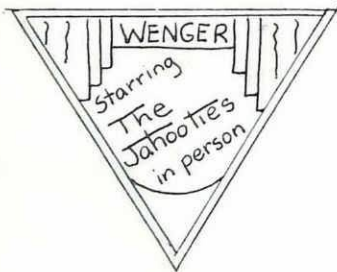
