- Administer the EXPLORE survey to eighth graders to identify learning needs, interests, strengths and areas for improvement.

Our middle schools also provide special interest clubs and extracurricular activities. Each school has a counselor to advise students and has implemented a program for creating a safe school culture free of harassment and discrimination.

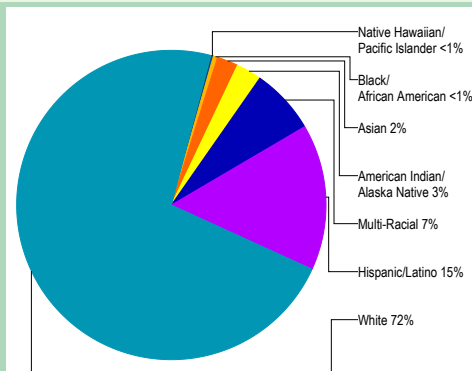

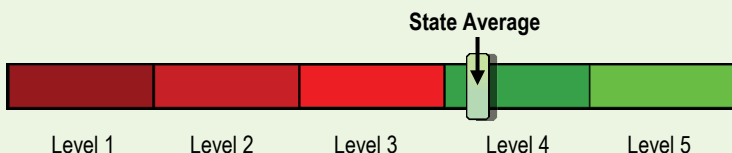

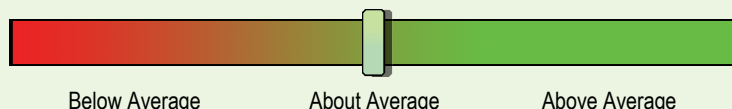

Compared to all schools statewide in 2013-14, this school is rated as Level 4.



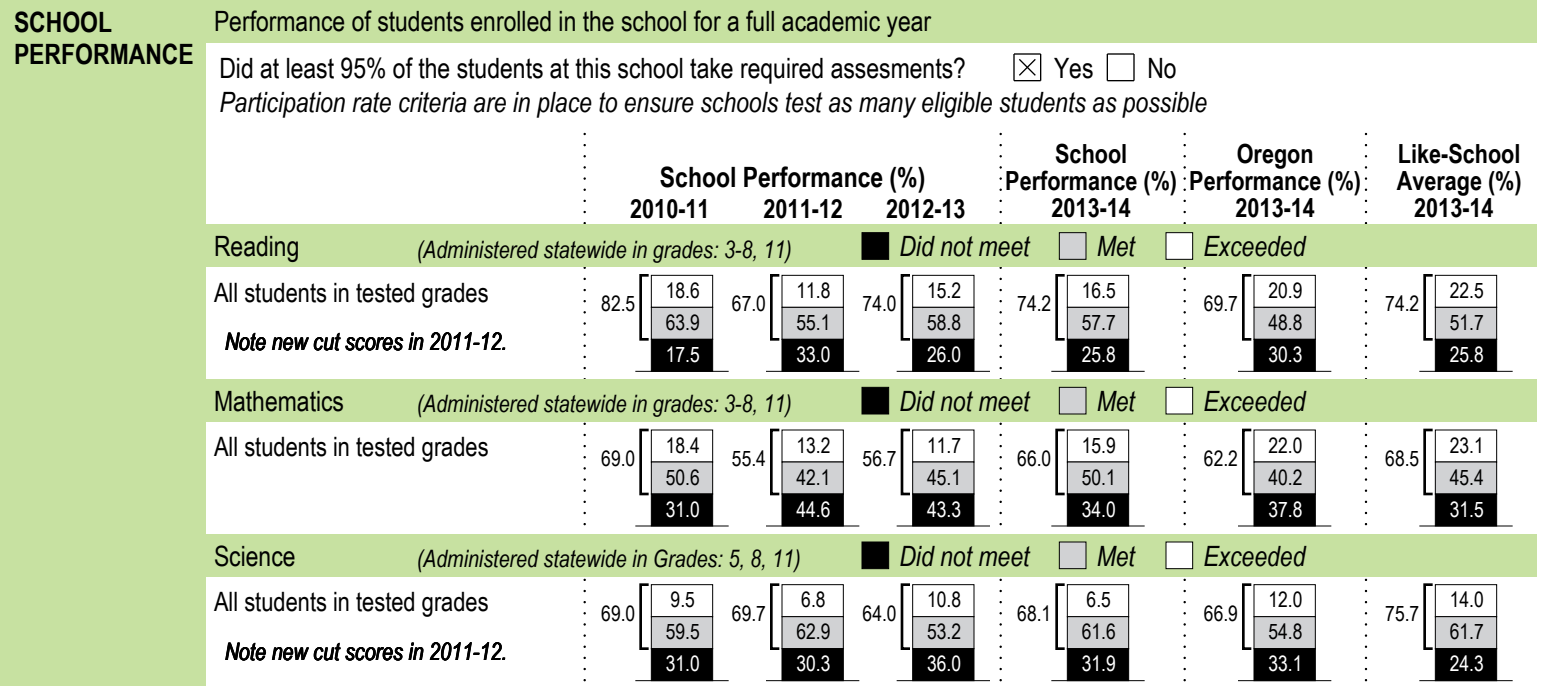
- Level 1** = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools
