## ACA 1095-A,B,C Form FAQ:

**What is a 1095-A form, and will I get one?** If you have been enrolled in insurance through 4J, you will <u>not</u> receive a 1095-A form for 2016. 1095-A forms are only distributed from the Marketplace for individuals who elected coverage through the exchange.

How can I prove that I had health insurance for all of 2016? The 1095-B form will come directly from Moda that shows you had health insurance in 2016.

What form does the district send to say I was offered affordable/unaffordable health insurance for 2016? You will receive a 1095-C form from the district stating we offered you affordable coverage for the months that you were employed.

When can I expect to receive my 1095-B,C form? The IRS has allowed employers and insurance carriers until March 2nd to mail these notices to covered individuals.

Which form tells me how much I've paid in insurance premiums for 2016? There will not be a form that indicates the amount you've paid in premiums, however there is a box on your W-2 that shows the amount paid by *employer and employee* toward medical insurance (box 12DD).

How can I find out how much I've paid for health insurance in 2016? For total amount that you've paid in insurance premiums (including medical, dental, vision, prescription) you can look on your December 2016 paystub on the right hand side under "Pre-Tax Deductions", " Health Insurance".

**Do I have to wait until I receive my 1095-B,C forms to file my 2016 taxes?** >From my understanding, but I urge you to confirm with your tax professional, you will not need either the 1095-B nor the 1095-C forms to file your 2016 taxes.
