Classification Summary

Installs, maintains, and repairs security locks, door closures, latches and related hardware for District buildings and vehicles; fabricates and duplicates keys.

Supervisory Relationships

Reports to the Maintenance Services Supervisor. May be required to provide technical oversight to other staff.

Examples of Duties

- 1. Diagnose, repair, and manufacture parts for locks, safes, file cabinets, door closures, panic bars, door knobs, and related security devices.
- 2. Change lock or safe combinations; maintain records or combinations and re-setting schedules.
- 3. Pick locks and pinning; repair or replace tumbler springs or other lock parts.
- 4. may be required safes, file and related records of springs or
- 5. Fabricate new or duplicate keys for cylinder, cabinet, and padlocks; code keys from code books.
- 6. Establish and maintain parts inventories and key schedules.
- 7. Maintain security of duplicate keys.
- 8. Maintains regular and prompt attendance.
- 9. Performs other related duties as assigned.

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

- 1. Knowledge of methods, materials, tools, and equipment used repairing locks and making keys.
- 2. Ability to operate keying machine, metal lathe, milling machine, and metal fabricating equipment.
- 3. Ability to design lock security systems for large buildings.
- 4. Ability to read shop drawings and work from oral or written specifications for locksmith work.

Minimum Qualifications for Class Entry

- 1. Completion of a recognized apprenticeship program as a locksmith, or equivalent training and experience.
- 2. Possession of a valid State of Oregon driver's license.

Work Environment

Work is performed in a maintenance shop facility or in District buildings. Incumbents may required to perform emergency repairs during evening or weekend hours.
