SCHOOL BUILDING REPLACEMENT & RENOVATION

ROOSEVELT MIDDLE SCHOOL – Tuesday, Feb. 20, 2018

Rebuild Edison (on-site) keeping the façade. We love our neighborhood school!

Support improvements for North Eugene HS to strengthen North region.

YG needs a K–8 with 3 kindergartens to feed it. First Japanese immersion school in the nation should no longer be overlooked.

YG need K-8 & own building (ideal). Must have 3 kindergartens to maintain high quality. Current building does not meet needs. Prefer K-8 in one location.

Camas Ridge – equity – paying to upgrade Willard for temporary use while ignoring current needs of Camas doesn't make sense. Alternative school use for Willard and equitable. (no busing, different set of people able to use). Camas & Edison were listed together as needing rebuilding. Why has Camas completely dropped off the list? Our site can be in use while a new school is built.

Edison – renovate front façade (save the history) & remodel (new info. at effective teaching & learning sites).

What about getting Edison historically recognized & celebrated?

Camas Ridge is a Title 1 school. You wouldn't give us a temporary or even a yurt last time, but you promised us we'd be in the next bond. Now, we're shut out again, in favor of renovating a school (Willard) with no students. The Sheldon region projections are fine, but the Camas projections did not consider Amazon Camas, a 117-unit apartment building. Equity should be more than a slogan.

Edison – Rebuild on its current site. Save the historical façade. Walkable neighborhood school should be a priority

Keep Edison – Keep historical façade. Keep walking school. Keep current site.

K–8 at YG to strengthen the cultural & language supports & continuity.

Edison – Seismic renovation or rebuild. Increase capacity on site. Built in 1925. Desperately need renovation.

Make case for increasing student population (e.g. vs. univ. over building for students)

Keep Edison kids safe. 1926 building needs renovation. Retain historic character to honor our past but build new behind to honor our future.

Edison is a <u>TRUE</u> neighborhood school. It is the anchor that keeps it a neighborhood. Keep the historical and valuable part of our neighborhood. Edison's architecture fits the feel of the neighborhood. Let's keep it and make it better with the improvements necessary for a modern school.

Explain to SUNA & options for Edison (why is saving façade only so much more expensive?

Edison is a great neighborhood school. Renovate or rebuild Edison. Historic façade is worth keeping if possible. Keep the site as open as possible, 3 stories perhaps & rebuild.

Keep Edison & rebuild with front façade. It is the heart of the community. Oldest school for rebuilding.

Keep Edison at current site & rehab/upgrade, respecting its historic / visual contributions to the neighborhood. NOT just "facadism" but real rehab & adding to if needed).

North HS – Needs renovation. Investment to maintain, not fall behind.

Come to SUNA meeting – May? (see Nancy)

Edison - Safety

Edison is the last & best example of our historic schools. It would be a shame to raze it without full consideration of alternatives for renovation to keep school on site & in neighborhood. I would like to see the depth of the process for Edison so far. Is there an alternative analysis available (perhaps master plan?)

Keep Edison at its current site and go to the extra time & trouble to honor the historical architecture while still modernizing and ensuring it's safe & secure. For example, preserve the north façade, however destroying the character of the school & neighborhood is unacceptable.

If you insist on rebuilding Edison on site, rebuild Camas on the SW corner of the lot, put the Edison kids there for a year while rebuilding, then put the Camas kids there. Don't renovate Willard – a school with no students.

We're very fortunate here in the US. I don't understand why bigger, better is always the goal. Millions of kids worldwide would love to attend even our poorest buildings.

Working with the city to ensure that new schools have kitchens and cafeterias etc. that could serve the community in emergencies could be a win-win. Let's not miss out on this opportunity like we did with RMS and others.

Smaller class sizes in a safe space!

Provide YG its own building that is for a K–8. YG is fragmented and has site shared with another school which prevents us from growing. BV has 3 kinders, YG as an immersion needs the same to handle attrition that is not replaced in the upper grades. Having a K–8 allows sharing of Japanese cultural resources and staff support. One Japanese teacher at a school is not a program. Japanese materials are not easy to come by. Having all in one school for an immersion school makes sense.

Edison is unsafe – both crowding and seismic. Proximity of current site to UO is critical to maintain and build collaborative programming.

Please make clear in your bond info. materials that "swing school" renovation would not <u>only</u> be for Edison – that it can be used for other renovations/rebuilds as a swing school as well! (or if you have a clear-subsequent program idea for the site, then the approach is: renovate "X" school to move "Y" program into, use as swing school for 1 year while Edison re-build takes place...

Think public needs to know also which schools may be on the next bond – there are many buildings /programs that need attention – let folks know when their turn will come up...

Edison – New building on same site. No parking lot. Use renovated Willard as temp school. Sheldon – New elementary school – North Eugene High – New building with update/modern tech & security.

Reduce over-crowding in grade schools in part by housing pre-, K-, & possibly 1st inside area eldercare facilities. My son would love a bunch of grandparents every day.

Do more specific planning about future of Willard so that voters understand the long-term investment necessary at this site. What is the cost of doing nothing at Willard? It's a stand-alone project!!!

Couple people suggested different wording re: swing school.

Continuing to build to our future & projected growth Edison is critical - staying on same property. Consider needs of All students in area. – Parking vs. other safe routes are important factors. – Also equity across district is important to me.

4J EDUCATION CENTER — Saturday, Feb. 24, 2018

Alternate site for Edison – RMS – NEHS – no remodel è new only reopen/Incorporate the auto body shop at North! Weather remodel or rebuild. Offer tech. training classes as an alternative to college.

Yujin Gakuen should be a K–8 program. The current Japanese Immersion program falls apart after the 5th grade. Leveraging existing schools like Howard & Kelly to integrate as part of the K–8 program would strengthen Japanese Immersion. The teachers at YG are amazing and deserve to have a strong voice in deciding what the new program should look like. Please include them in discussions on the future of the program.

Yes, Yujin Gakuen needs to be K–8 in their own building in the North Region.
NEHS needs a new building.

ARTS & TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY — Monday, Feb. 26, 2018

Use more inclusive process for new school buildings design – involve neighborhood.

Go for a larger bond issue (\$450M)

No parking lots – (multi-level). Waste of money that can be better spent on nearly anything else.

Love the idea of using the Willard site for something needed/productive.

Sell Willard – Use money for upgrades to other schools.

Keep on elementary school at Edison site. Try to rebuild/remodel to retain historic façade along 22nd & Emerald. But 1st priority is a neighborhood school there.

Don't rebuild Edison – It's too old. Split the children between Camas Ridge/Willard sounds like good idea. (**) I agree. (*)

I support strongly rebuilding Edison.

Replace both Camas Ridge & Edison; use new Camas school for Edison students while Edison is being rebuild.

George Rogers – Carpenters Union Local 271 Email: concreteadvantage@msn.com - Concerns – With the new and remodeling of our public schools, I want to know what steps are being made to hire contractors and sub tier contractors that are involved with apprenticeship programs and provide a livable wage with benefits. Also, I would like to see funding for woodshop. The carpenters union is willing to help provide curriculum and some funding for tools/equipment.

Yujin Gakuen needs a permanent home in the event of construction at North Eugene. A dedicated building is strongly preferred.

Joey Carlson – While NEHS is a large expenditure the cost of re-using existing buildings & renovations is costly. The old gym at ATA is a good example. The quest to save money let to costly seismic renovation that likely cost more than replacement upfront. If NEHS remains a focus, new not renovated should be done. The YG & Corridor programs need to be accommodated as well. If 3 schools can be addressed with the funding, the cost makes better sense. If the 153M only addresses 1 school, leaving 2 others needing funding, it needs to be rebudgeted.

KELLY MIDDLE SCHOOL — Thursday, Feb. 27, 2018

An idea that was suggested was to tear down YG/Corridor & rebuild a K–8 YG just south of the current silver Lea building & not replace NEHS yet. EV? Except it would be perceived as inequitable (rightly so)

Build Functional Kitchen in every new building! Big and able to cook for hundreds of people from scratch. Dishwashers, 3-compartment sinks for sanitizing dishes, stores & ovens, pots and pans. For everyday, for emergencies for teaching, learning, nourishing.

I support a new building for North with a big, functional kitchen.

When North is rebuilt, there are two elementary programs that would need to be relocated that are housed in the building on site. (YG and Corridor).

New building or Camas Ridge. not enough space for all students. Building does not feel healthy for anyone.

How about focusing on elementary schools this bond (e.g. a new Silver Lea in North region) & use next 2-3 years to have a community-wide discussion about what the high school of the future should look like when we do rebuild them (they will likely be very different...)

I think YG's success, as a K–5 language immersion needs to be advanced into a stand-alone K–8 school (not with other students, which loses the value of a true K–8 whether immersion or not). If North High is rebuilt, make YG K–8 a part of that plan. Research of K–8 schools is clear that education & behavior improve over K–5 and middle school. Coburg Charter is a nice local example, but building on YG's language program adds even more value!

Covered stands for North track!

Better security coming into buildings! metal detectors?

If NEHS is rebuilt – please keep a similar or same façade. The school is beautiful! Please <u>no</u> 2 story. Use more brick so much more lovely! (not al all fond of exterior at Howard and RRD)

I don't want to see fancy new buildings, I want to see more improvement in various schools, not just a few. Have equal distribution of the money. (*)

Build buildings not luxury facilities. We don't need fancy. We need safe and stable and clean. ATA has automatic sliding glass doors? Why? Too fancy. Fancy light fixtures also, why?

It would cost less money and serve more people over a wider geographical area to not use bond money to rebuild NEHS and instead rebuild Edison, renovate older buildings, and build new in Sheldon area.

YG has a portable library with a dry/rot floor. Furniture stored in the hallways. Wi-Fi that doesn't work. Kids can't log on to do testing.

A new NEHS building could help attract and retain students in the North region. It is currently the oldest HS in 4J. The North region could really benefit from new HS that could also be used as a community hub for multiple purposes.

Sell Edison property. Relocate students to Willard permanently after improvements are made. Parking needs at current Edison.

How do we keep YG in our region? Admiral property...? YG, Spanish immersion <u>all</u> at Kelly? No. Too many pegs trying to fit in square hole.

Concerning inequities across program support. Would love to see dedicated building for Japanese immersion.

Could some middle schools be converted to 5th to 8th grade to reduce elementary school crowding? Could some middle schools and elementary schools become K–8? (**)

Move YG to Madison K-8 and rebuild Madison on Admiral property?

Monroe is in need of a new band room. We have more than half the school pop. in the music program. 487 of population is low income. Music will increase attendance, test cores, graduation rates. Facilities upgrades at Camas are essential if a new school is not possible. We must address overcrowding and unsafe situation for our students.

My 3rd grader @ YG spends his entire day in a moldy soggy portable building. No plumbing or AC.

For YG to sustain with quality it needs to be a K–I, or Pre K–8. There <u>needs</u> to be room for this under one roof. It doesn't matter where. (*****)

^ v Yes this will help the North community as well.

Year round school. (*)

Where/how are Japanese teachers being recruited to support a growing program from K-5 to K-8? YG K-8 could live at Kinney Loop School.

Rebuild Monroe MS. Horrible facilities, violating fire code – too many kids in band, no track, too many problems to mention.

Include "support for learning" focus in all new school facilities tie together. ^ Agree.

Make sure to build real kitchens to new schools/renovated schools.

^ Agree. Hi tec.

Replace NEHS. Remodels are very expensive for the benefits gained. Retrofits for energy efficiency & seismic performance are costly. Retaining portions of the building is not cost=effective & limits options to improve the building and campus. Build new. Build to higher seismic standard build for energy efficiency Yes (***)

FACILITY UPGRADES & REPAIRS

ROOSEVELT MIDDLE SCHOOL - Tuesday, Feb. 20, 2018

Facility upgrades for safety is important. If the school is safe – Don't rebuild for beauty spend extra money on smaller class sizes!

Top priority—Safety—Seismic—Security. Is it possible to renovate to meet these goals without building a new school?

Build all school gyms/cafeterias/kitchens to serve as emergency shelter after a major seismic event, partner w/city, EWEB, etc.

Be clear on seismic upgrades for Willard to be for a future program to be relocated there permanently such as alternative HS & MS. Not just for a temporary use as a swing school. Best to upgrade all other buildings to same level as Willard's upgrades to be equitable & equally safe.

Please prioritize localizing our school food equipping schools for that purpose.

Consider equity when prioritizing expenditures.

Remodel of Willard needs to be sold as a solution for multiple school rebuilds & possible new school in the long run.

Building resiliency into new structures:

2 things to stress:

Provides emergency shelter to communities at large during a disaster

Is simply prudent stewardship so that we will have <u>some</u> part of school buildings standing for re-occupancy: cheaper than rebuilding!!

Seismic improvement will get votes! Please help as many schools as possible! Is it worth it to upgrade Willard, a school with no neighborhood attendees, while leaving out others that need safety improvements?

Priorities - Safety & seismic.

Seismic safety is very important & should be at all schools.

Facility upgrades and money for nutrition services overlap. Can we think strategically about how we ask for and then use those funds?

Increase space for Yujin Gakuen so we can accept more students – 3 kindergartens help relieve attrition that leads & blending of upper grades.

Please prioritize immediate re-occupancy after a major seismic event for gyms and cafeterias – at least one major facility in every area. Work with city to prioritize pipes to these areas. Apply for FEMA grants to safeguard community. Consider monolithic dome construction.

Educate community about past, present and future growth trends to enable voters to assess a full picture, prior to decision-making.

4J EDUCATION CENTER — Saturday, Feb. 24, 2018

Look at consistent seismic upgrades for all schools. (note in bond which schools.)

Voice enhancement district wide ASAP – savings/premium.

Tech. classes vs. college. (North auto body shop).

Security & Seismic upgrades should take priority.

Safety upgrades should not make our schools feel like prisons.

^ I second this sentiment

As you build fences around school, I hope you keep playgrounds accessible after hours to the neighborhood. Building a new school with playground equipment and not allowing the kids in the area to use it on weekends is a shame. (I hope you don't build a locked fence around Howard that is not open after hours.)

ARTS & TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY — Monday, Feb. 26, 2018

We need a better solution to protect against flying projectiles and knocked over bookshelves that are not secure. This is serious hazard if earthquake.

Partner with Western Shelter for CTE – emergency shelter provider/manufacturer on w. 11th.

Emergency water cisterns for the community at schools.

Involve parents in school emergency preparedness plans.

I like the idea of bringing back CTE programs in school. The upgrades to facilities should incorporate these.

I <u>love</u> having one school in each region that can serve as a shelter – <u>but</u> consider building the <u>entire</u> building to that standard. – Also – those schools should have <u>functional</u> kitchens that can feed people. (******) ^ Yes!! Great point.

We are ethically obligated to make sure ALL schools in 4J are seismically stable. (*)

If buildings are designed as green, efficient schools, they can be used for teaching students about energy, conservation, etc. (and we will be thinking about mitigating climate change).

Our schools need kitchen upgrades. In order to provide healthy lunches there need to be actual kitchens. (**)

For both, facility upgrades and new buildings, consider designing spaces to accommodate non-profit community groups to provide activities for kids. Sports are great, but music/art build communities too, and it seems many facilities can't accommodate them currently.

4J needs to become a member of Lane County organizations active in disaster.

Lead map your neighborhood effort in the schools with CERT.

Critical repairs, maintenance, along with equitable & accessible facilities should be the top focus in this section. Security, safety & health would be next. Seismic & disaster recovery would need to be a latter focus, since they address "what if" not fix or address issues that are present now.

KELLY MIDDLE SCHOOL — Thursday, Feb. 27, 2018

I feel you need to continue with the 2 new middle schools and 2 new elementary schools model. YG is a disaster; it needs help. There is no AC, no security to water in our portables. The roof tile leak, we need money spent on spaces that are safe and healthy.

Serious security inequities across district concerning would like to see assessment.

Seismic improvements and resiliency for disaster recovery spaces should include functional kitchens large enough to serve hundreds of people. Food from scratch complete with 3 compartment sinks to wash, rinse and sanitize in an emergency. A place to bake lots, stove tops to boil water, soups, big pots and pans, etc.

Space for project based learning. Agree with below – children with special needs of all kinds should be able to go to neighborhood schools and alternative schools should also accommodate them.

Provide appropriate work spaces for related services professionals. Consult w/ Psych., OT, PT., SLP, etc on needs for specific disciplines. (Conference rooms are not adequate).

Allow children with special needs to be served in their neighborhood school through space and staffing. Bond can help build appropriate spaces for children's diverse needs at <u>all</u> schools.

Outdoor school for all natural resource CTE.

Sick I am

Programmatic planning to ensure space for diverse & changing needs.

Please incorporate more meal prep in grade and middle schools, so children learn how to make nutritious food by growing and making food for themselves – for their own lunch programs

Lower student to teacher ratio i.e.: smaller class sizes seems to likely fix lots of problems-better quieter learning spaces.

Very positive to hear adding flexible learning spaces (e.g. Sped sensory rooms) for all students. But can be reimagined over time! to new building & existing buildings.

Ensure spaces are available and appropriate for programs such as language immersion like YG – enough space and set-up for technology

Bring CTE back to NEHS – Motor room @ Howard is AMAZING!! make more of those – Invest in the little people. ECE is so important.

<u>Reopen</u> the auto body shop at North. There is a staff member willing to teach it. It could impact the drop out rates drastically to offer an alternative to college!

The way the Howard building was designed is great for S.P.ED classes!

YG/Corridor building too cramped. Not enough room for both schools in one building. Too many programs at Kelly. Japanese program seems like lower priority than Spanish immersion, technology immersion.

Need to decide what the future of Japanese program is. There is a high demand for the program, but seems to have little support from school board. Offer K–8 Japanese program. Kelly is unable to support the program for YG students. Japanese program needs to be fully thought out to support the students and help them succeed.

Offer more CTE courses, leveraging online learning to increase choice at the various high schools.

Music education/facility at Monroe M.S. – 120 beginning band students (2 periods) – 80 intermediate band students (1 period) have to meet in cafeteria – 60 advanced band students – Music room too small, no practice rooms or places for kids to practice outside the group. – Equipment having to be moved between cafeteria/music room everyday. – Large # of students for room size (and for 1 teacher!)

ARTS & TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY — Monday, Feb. 26, 2018

CTE is really important. I'm so glad to see the support of the robotics program at SEHS. Would be great to encourage at all high schools.

Western Shelters possible CTE partner, will email contact info. to Jim Torrey.

I'm supportive of gym space facilitating PE for all <u>middle</u> schoolers. Bodies & habits are forming during that age & activity very important.

Construction school excise tax? (enacted 2007?)

KidSports facilities.

Would put priority on CTE Spaces and Churchill gym.

Have a clear plan for how to use & the purpose of maker spaces.

Focus on CTE is good – kids need alternatives as they mature into adult that are not solely academic focused "Real World" tech, etc. (*)

Fund Edison, wait on the rest...

Building use fees – are they competitive?

Include spaces for art, fiber arts, drawing, painting, music, plays. (*)

PE for every child is essential. I strongly support any measure to increase the amount of physical activity.

Space for emotional support - Quiet space for meditation, yoga, even conflict resolution.

Very supportive of CTE options, even vocational for students. Always supportive of getting kids active – gyms, fields. (*)

More of a focus on CTE and community need.

Meeting the safety needs for staff & students by adding SPED space is vital. Meeting state mandated PE time is also required. These too appear to be the top. CTE facilitates higher graduation rates, which is also a primary focus, though would be 3rd. Early learning while an important item, would likely need to be #4. If offsets for the space needs are met by new construction, then the budget should be revised down to match. PE @ up to \$30M plus \$8M at Churchill seems high.

KELLY MIDDLE SCHOOL — Thursday, Feb. 27, 2018

#1 here = early learning spaces.

I would like the strong Japanese immersion program at YG to have a <u>true</u> continuation in middle school and high school. A single teacher and/or class is <u>not</u> true immersion. A true K–8 for Japanese immersion is a reasonable starting place.

Love early learning but concerned about existing program needs 1st.

The music programs need physical space to fit the kids. Their band rooms are not big enough to have all the class sit.

School food is important for good learning. We need local food, simple & nutritious.

Can we use a portion of the 10M for nutrition services to conduct a feasibility study to determine how best to use the remaining funds?

Can 4J use of this funding for better school food. Most staff members do not eat food in cafeteria. How about benchmarking the school lunches to those in France, Italy, and Japan. None of this, or very little gets thrown away.

What we eat is what we are! Isidore (10 year old).

I think that the food in school matters because if your parent or you don't have enough time to pack yourself a meal you may starve or be hungry. That's why there is school food. The school food isn't the best here, but we could support local farms. Therefore kids in school do not focus s much.

Let's get Eugene kids out of cars and onto bikes & their feet! SRTS is critical.

Hub bussing for choice schools so they are available to all families.

As part of food service facilities re-vamp, can we integrate education about food into all levels of curriculum? (K–12) e.g. healthy eating, food prep, & food production & sourcing (how we can keep ourselves & our environment healthier through both consumption & production choices we make, as individuals and as a community (School garden program is a great example, but just tip of iceberg...)

I am applauding you for devoting 10+M for improving school food. Right now the school food is not conducive to the physical and mental health of our children and planet. It is highly processed, distributed by a corporation which sources ingredients that from industrial factory farms, high in pesticide residues, GMOs, sugar, trans fats, and foods that have been treated inhumanely and pumped full of hormones and GMO feed, etc. Trucked in from far away. This food system is not only immediately toxic and not nutritious for our children but also contributes to climate change via industrial agriculture (Something like 50% of carbon gases overheating the planet is generated from our current agricultural system). That is CO₂ gases generated through transportation as well. So if we could localize our school food we can protect our children's health and future. We can choose to feed the food grown locally in sustainable/climate friendly way, without chemicals. (We can regenerate our soils for sequestering the CO₂. If it's moving to a central kitchen or scratch food prep, it's not enough. 4J needs to make a plan and decide one way or another. Spend \$50K to do a feasibility study of new models of food prep. See what's possible. Then decide. Then budget in the bond. (*)
