built in an earlier era



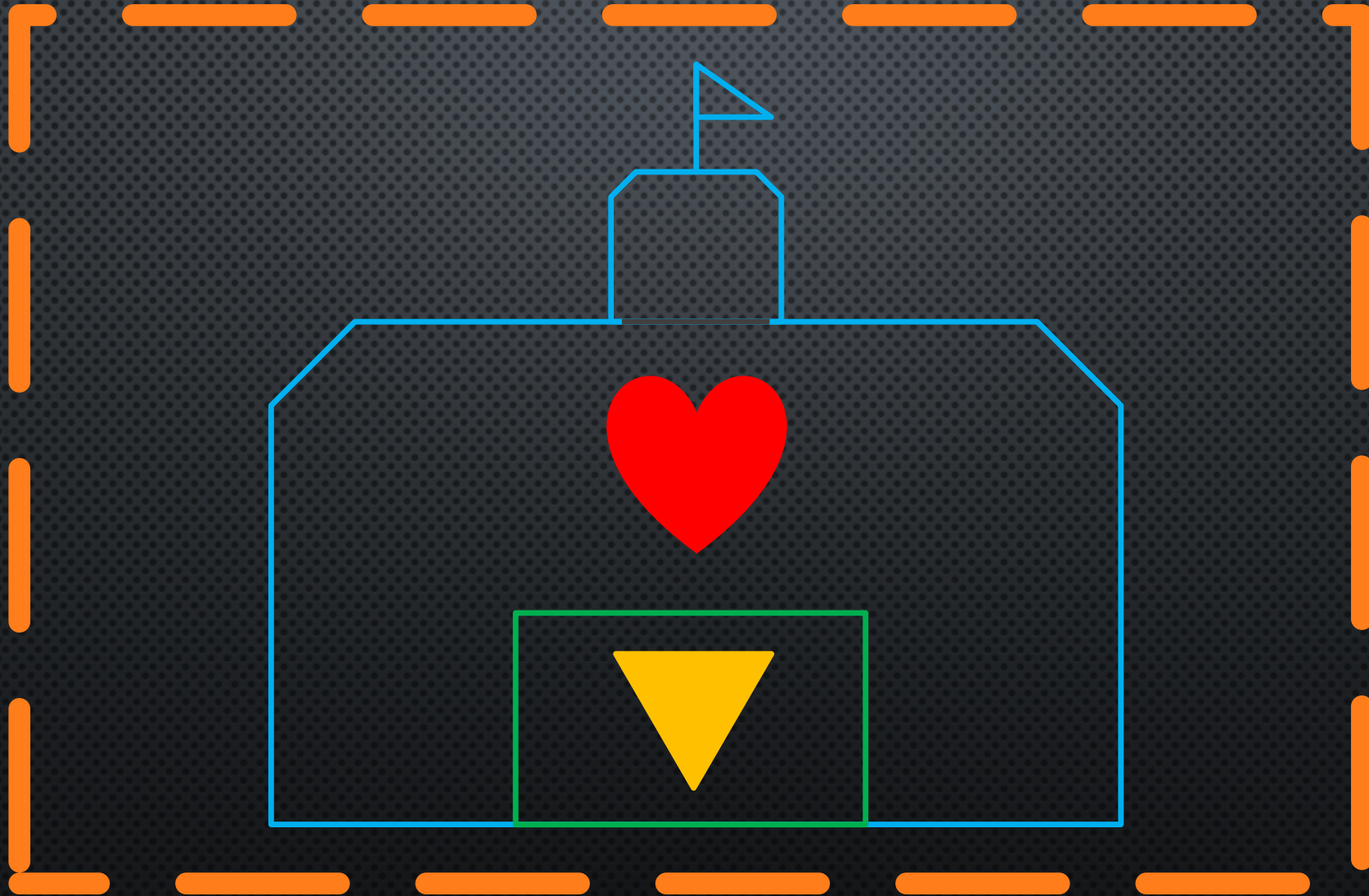
Schools 50–100 years ago

- Built like a string of one-room schoolhouses connected by a corridor
- Little collaboration and low visibility
- Out-of-view locations for problem behavior
- Easy access, with many entrances

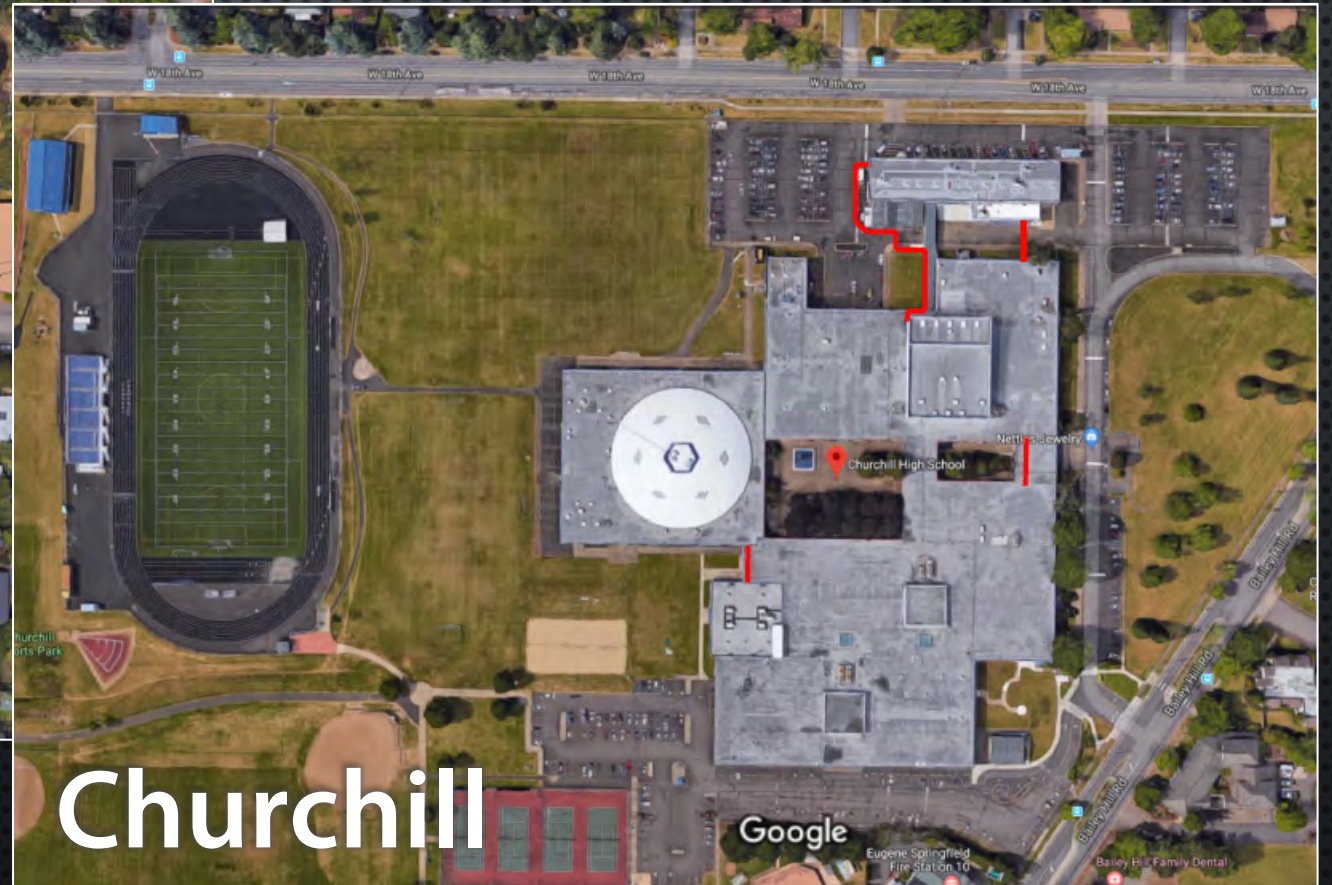
Today's schools

- **Work to have safe, welcoming environments and address student mental health**
- **Have few out-of-sight areas for problem behavior**
... and critically ...
- **Control access to enter our schools**

Securing our schools



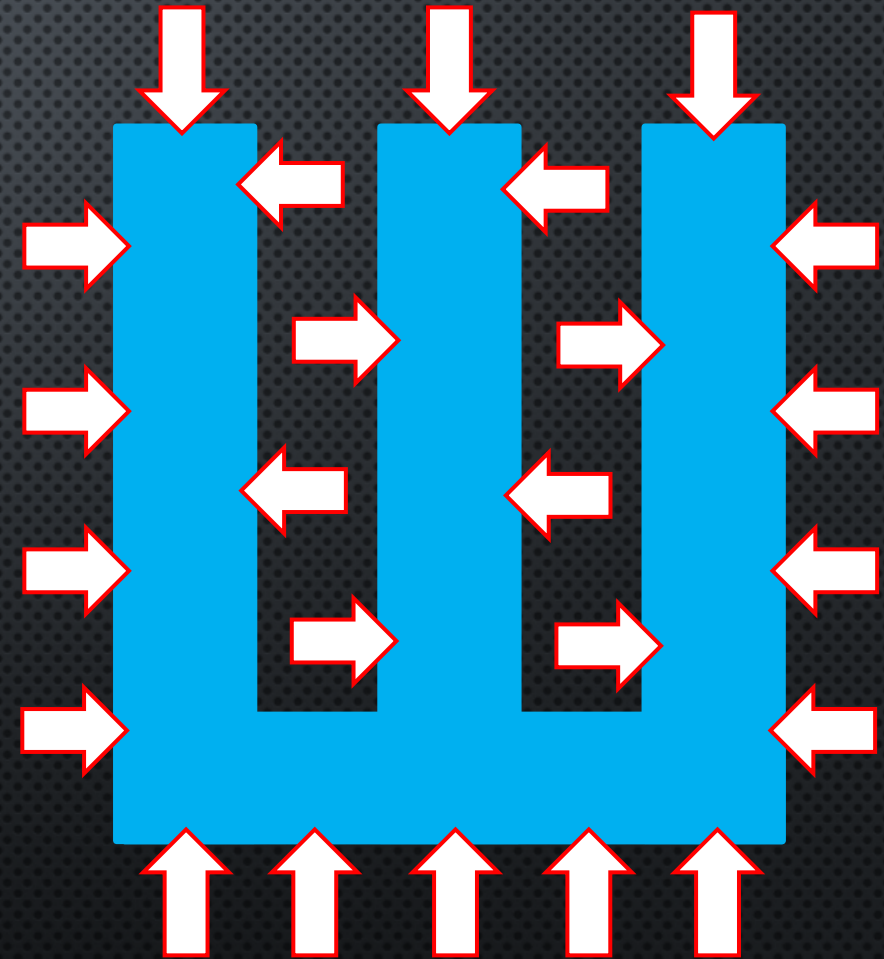
Perimeter fencing

Controlled access

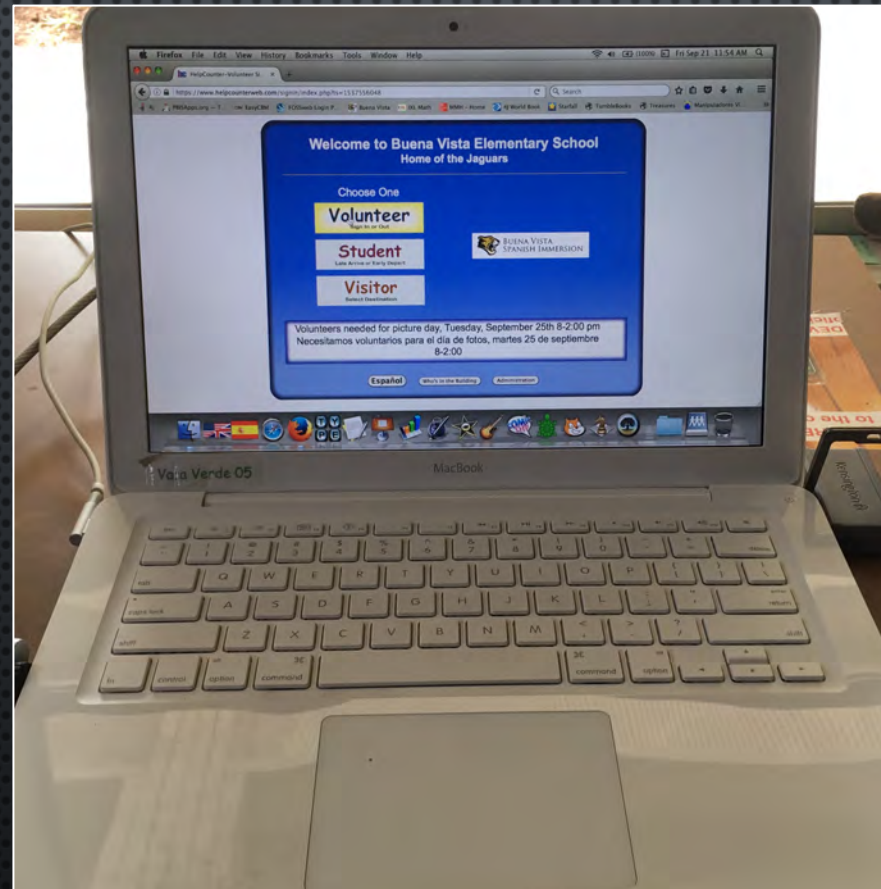

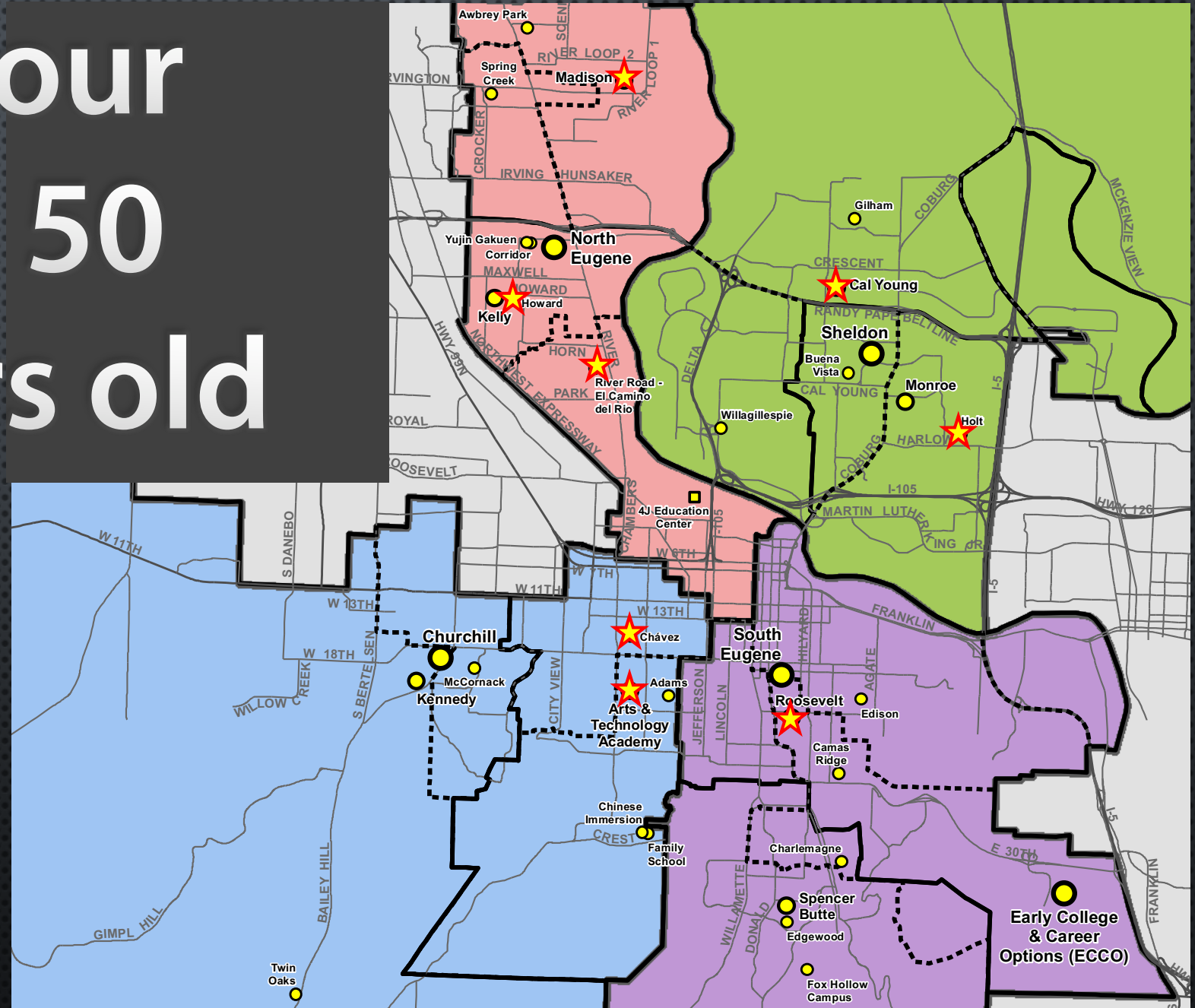
Check in/check out

The rest of our schools are 50 to 90+ years old



Security improvements to date

- Entryway security at some schools
- Perimeter fencing (building and/or site) at some schools
- Red key classroom locks
- Card access controls
- One-button lockdown at most schools
- Security camera rollout begins this year, high schools first

2018 bond measure

- **New schools with modern secure design:
North Eugene, Edison, Camas Ridge**
- **Security improvements at all 4J schools**
 - **One-button lockdown at remaining facilities**
 - **Secure entryways at remaining facilities**
 - **Building perimeter fencing in some locations**
 - **Glass shatter protection at many schools**

Future improvements

- Complete rollout of security cameras
- Consider additional technological enhancements (many options, depending on funding)
- Continue to improve school entry check-in and security
- Continue staff and student security training
