In addition to being able to work one-on-one with students extensively, our teachers work as mentors for our students by:


- Reaching out to families regarding additional student supports
- Providing weekly communication and progress reports with parents
- Tracking progress in all courses and connecting students with teachers in different subject areas on an as-needed basis

### **Key Benefit of EOA:**

- EOA is an asynchronous format, which allows students to learn at their own pace and from any location with the guidance of mentors and teachers.
- The format can be especially appealing to families who need a more flexible schedule.




## **EOA** offers intensive student support in the following ways:

- Asynchronous format allows for concentrated individual and small group instruction.
- Teachers support all students, meeting them where they are emotionally and academically.
- Students receive opportunities for support with technology, software, content, organization, and executive functioning from mentors and teachers.
- Teachers collaborate and monitor students with all classes to help students navigate asynchronous, online learning.
- Teacher/mentors address the diversity of needs with care and compassion

## Synchronous time

In addition to the self-paced instruction, we also offer weekly 45-minute synchronous, grade-level advisory sessions to support social/emotional learning and connection.

Directly following advisory, students are encouraged to get additional support from teachers, in content, technology, or sometimes just to check in!




#### Who attends EOA?

Student's choose EOA for a variety of reasons including, but not limited to

- The need to work at their own pace
- The desire for a more flexible schedule
- The ability to focus on mental or physical health needs

**Students find a safe place at EOA**, many have been victims of bullying, harassment, and/or racism.



EOA currently houses students pursuing professional goals in rowing, ballet and music, working around employment schedules and helping out with family responsibilities, as well as students in inpatient treatment, those suffering health/mental health issues, students who have been bullied and those who find anxiety and depression debilitating in an in-person setting. EOA enrolls many students with IEPs and 504s and students have found working at their own pace and/or in a quieter environment highly rewarding.

## **Student Example**

Many students experience anxiety and social pressures in school.

With support, students met regularly with teachers, logged on daily to complete work, and attended weekly synchronous advisory and support time.

As the student felt their stress diminish they were able to complete coursework on his own terms, which increased his feelings of control and autonomy. The student connected with other students through online discussions and during Synchronous Zoom Advisory meetings and developed a much stronger sense of social empowerment.

The student found that without the social pressures, they could confidently participate in his online classes without the fear of peer judgment while simultaneously building a social network.



# Flexibility in scheduling

#### Part-day programs

With communication between administrators, students are allowed to attend EOA on a part-time basis. We know this can meet the differing needs of many students. Students find a full day in the building overwhelming, resulting in anxiety and/or behavior issues that affect everyone's learning.
