CONOZCA SUS DERECHOS

SI AGENTES DE ICE LLEGAN A SU TRABAJO

ÁREAS PÚBLICAS V PRIVADAS

Un agente de ICE puede entrar en cualquier área de su lugar de trabajo que esté abierto al público, como un aparcamiento o un vestíbulo. Normalmente, un agente de ICE no puede entrar en áreas privadas sin permiso. Si puede, vaya a cualquier área que esté designada como privada o sólo para empleados. No deje entrar al agente a menos que tenga una orden firmada por un juez.

PREGUNTE SI SE PUEDE IR

Si el agente le dice que se puede ir, márchese con calma. No tiene que decir nada.

NO FIRME NADA

No firme ningún documento que no entienda completamente.

GUARDE SILENCIO

Tiene derecho a permanecer en silencio. No tiene que responder a preguntas sobre su estado migratorio o lugar de nacimiento. Aunque responda a algunas preguntas, puede parar cuando quiera.

PIDA HABLAR CON UN ABOGADO

Tiene derecho a hablar con un abogado. Tiene derecho a no contestar ninguna pregunta o a no firmar ningún documento hasta que haya consultado a un abogado. Si no tiene abogado, pida una lista de abogados gratuitos.

NO MUESTRE DOCUMENTOS FALSOS Y NO MIENTA

Si tiene documentos de inmigración válidos, muéstrelos. No muestre documentos falsos o documentos que no le pertenecen. No mienta sobre su estado migratorio. Esto puede tener graves consecuencias.



KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

IF ICE AGENTS SHOW UP AT YOUR WORK

PUBLIC V. PRIVATE AREAS

An ICE agent can enter any areas of your workplace that are open to the public, like a parking lot or lobby. An agent typically cannot enter private areas without permission. Go to any area that is designated private or for employees only. Don't let the agent in unless they have a warrant signed by a judge.

ASK IF FREE TO LEAVE

Ask the ICE agent if you are free to leave. If the agent says yes, calmly walk away. You don't have to say anything.

STAY SILENT

If the ICE agent says you are not free to leave, you have the right to remain silent. You don't have to answer questions about your immigration status or birthplace. Even if you answer some questions, you can refuse to answer any more.

DON'T SIGN ANY DOCUMENTS

Don't sign any documents you don't fully understand.

ASK TO SPEAK TO A LAWYER

You have the right to speak to a lawyer. You have the right not to answer any questions or sign any documents until you speak to a lawyer. If you don't have one, ask for a list of pro bono attorneys.

DON'T SHOW FALSE DOCUMENTS OR LIE

If you have valid immigration documents, show them. Don't show fake documents or documents that don't belong to you. Don't lie about your immigration status. This can have serious consequences.



If a Family Member is Detained

01 Find out their A-Number & contact the detention facility using the Department of Homeland Security. U.S Immigration and ... Online Detainee Locator System

02 Consult an immigration attorney

Once you know where they are, contact the detention facility to inquire about visitation hours and how to communicate with them.

03 Gather relevant documents

Collect any immigration documents, passports, work visas, and criminal records that may be relevant to their case.

04 Consider contacting a family support organization

Organizations like Freedom for Immigrants can provide additional support and guidance.
