## SUPPORT FOR CAREGIVERS: NAVIGATING THE TRANSITION PROCESS

If you are the parent or caregiver of a child with an IEP that is at least 14 years old, your child's school is developing a transition plan for them. The planning process should involve the input of you and your child. Preparing your child to become more independent can be a very stressful process. This free, virtual support group will bring together a small group of 6-8 parents and caregivers that are going through this process. The goal of the group is to provide education and support. Each week will focus on a different topic. Resources on that topic will be provided before each meeting. The resources will be discussed during the meeting but it is not necessary to have reviewed the material in advance. This group will be facilitated by Ellen Rose. Ellen is a graduate student at Framingham State University in the Counseling Psychology Program. She is the Graduate Assistant at the Chris Walsh Center for Educators and Families of MetroWest. She is also the parent of two adult children with disabilities.

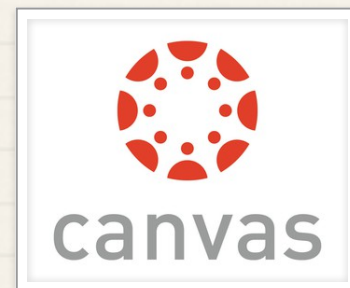

## COLLEGE LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

### COUNSELOR LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

Juniors applying to four-year colleges next year will most likely need a counselor letter of recommendation. However, they will find out for sure by checking the "application requirements" on the websites of the colleges to which they are applying. In order to write a letter of recommendation, counselors will need to be told in advance that students need a letter. **Learn more about transcripts and letters of recommendation on Canvas, [here](#).**

### TEACHER LETTER(S) OF RECOMMENDATION

Juniors applying to four-year colleges next year will most likely need one to two teacher letters of recommendation. However, they will need to find out the exact number required by checking the "application requirements" on the websites of the colleges to which they are applying. Students should ask teachers for letters of recommendation **IN PERSON**, and they should be teachers from their junior year (e.g. this year). Students should ask:

- One **humanities** teacher (English or history)
- One **STEM** teacher (math or science)

## Important SAT/ACT Test Day Information:

Make sure you bring what you need for test day! This includes a printed copy of your admissions ticket, a photo ID (a school ID is valid), No.2 pencils, and an approved calculator (the list can be found [here](#)).

## What is the Difference Between the SAT/ACT?

There are a few key differences between the SAT and the ACT. ACT scores range between 1-36, and SAT scores range between 800-1600. The ACT allows a calculator to be used for all math sections; the SAT only permits a calculator on some sections (though, both tests focus on arithmetic, Algebra I&II, Geometry, and Trigonometry). ACT does have a science focus, unlike the SAT. \*Both the ACT & SAT are accepted by almost all colleges/universities in the U.S.

## Should I take the ACT/SAT Combo Practice Test?

**Yes!** For all the reasons above, you may have a standardized test preference. The only way to find out which one you have is to take a sample of each test. Contact Ms. Erikson for details on how to find an online combo practice test.

## Do I Qualify for a Fee Waiver, & Where Do I Get One?

Do you have free/reduced lunch and/or receive any financial assistance? If so, you qualify for a SAT fee waiver! A fee waiver covers the cost of up to two SAT tests and three SAT Subject Tests. If you need an **SAT or ACT fee waiver** please contact Ms. Erikson ([rschmid@framingham.k12.ma.us](mailto:rschmid@framingham.k12.ma.us)) and she will get you a code and help you register.

## How do I Send Schools my ACT/SAT Scores?

Official [SAT/ACT](#) scores must be submitted through their respective websites. **Scores are NOT sent by FHS students' respective colleges.** Four score sends are covered by the registration fee for both the SAT and ACT. Students who qualify for free/reduced lunch get up to eight free score sends.

## SAT / ACT PRACTICE WITH SUMMIT EDU GROUP

Whether you have 10th grade students looking for baseline testing, a 7th grader looking to try an SSAT for the first time or an 11th grader wanting to check in on their progress, we have several different options. 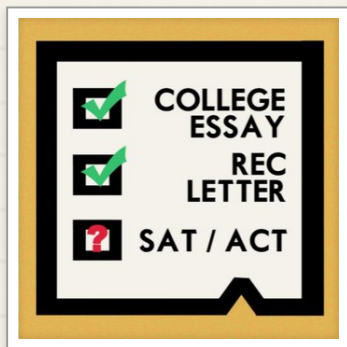

## THE TOEFL EXAM

The **Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)** is a standardized test that measures English language ability for non-native speakers who plan to enroll in an English-speaking college/university—the test evaluates listening, reading, writing, and speaking skills in relationship to academic tasks.

Test costs range between \$150-\$225. Unfortunately, no financial aid is offered for the TOEFL test. 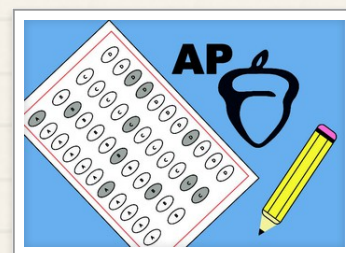

- **Virtual Reality Boot Camp (10 students):** April 2- May 14 (Saturdays), 8am-3pm. Students will complete their own VR project. Participants earn 3 college credits.
- **Renewable Energy Technology Boot Camp (20 students):** April 16-May 14 (Saturdays), 2022, 8am-3pm. Students will build small-scale, fully operational models of energy harvesting systems. Participants earn 2 college credits, plus a \$75 stipend.
- **Biotechnology Workshop (10 students):** April 20-22, 2022 (Wed-Fri), 9am-3:30pm. Students will conduct lab experiments, plus take a site visit to a biotech company. Participants receive a \$100 stipend.


