Thank you, all, for a wonderful year - and good luck on your future endeavors! -Rachel Erikson, FHS College & Career Counselor




MANDATORY SENIOR SURVEY: DUE MAY 10th

The senior survey is a MANDATORY requirement for all Class of 2024 students. It must be completed by Friday, May 10, 2024. This is a graduation requirement so please let us know if you need help accessing the Class of 2024 Senior Survey.

HOW TO ACCESS THE SURVEY:

- Log on to your NAVIANCE account: https://student.naviance.com/framingham If you forgot your password, recover it by clicking "forgot password" and a new one will be emailed to you. Please contact your counselor, House Office Manager, or Ms Ramirez (School Counseling Dept Head) at iramirez@framingham.k12.ma.us), if you are unable to access your account.
- Click on the dropdown below your initials to open tab on the upper right side > Surveys >Surveys From Your School > Senior Survey: Class of 2024.
- Question #7 is where you write the college or university you are attending, if applicable. Colleges require a final transcript and this is how we will know where to send yours! If you have not made a final decision, you may wait to submit the survey until you do so.



Transitioning emails / losing FPSED email

- Go to <u>takeout.google.com</u> →This service will help you to transfer your files and other content to another personal Google account or will prepare it to be saved as a downloadable file.
 Follow the Takeout instructions to determine which of the services you want to transfer data from. (We would recommend, at minimum, your Contacts, Drive content, and Mail.)
- Your Google Drive storage space will remain available over this summer. It will officially expire
 on December 31st, 2024. Please email helpdesk@framingham.k12.ma.us if you are having
 difficulties with this or if you can no longer access your account.

Forward your @fpsed.org email to another address: You will likely not be using your @fps.org email

address that you'll be using more frequently. You can follow these instructions, created by Google, to automatically forward your school email to a personal email account, so that you don't miss any important information in the next 6 months.

Summer To-Do for Students Attending MassBay

- Complete the senior survey so that your school counselor knows to send your final transcript to Mass Bay. To do this you will: Log-in to <u>Naviance</u> --> click 'about me' in top right corner --> click 'my surveys' on drop down --> click Class of 2024 survey and complete
- Take an <u>Accuplacer</u> exam (placement test for math and English); this virtual test will place you in a math and English course at Mass Bay (it is not pass/fail). You can <u>sign-up here</u>.
- 3. Register for a fall <u>Orientation</u> slot (via your Mass Bay **SOAR account**) follow steps 1-4. Here are the dates you can take an orientation.



Orientations will be available through an online platform called Launch Point.

Tuition Equity & MASFA

Massachusetts has now expanded eligibility for in-state tuition to students who have attended Massachusetts high schools for at least three years and earned a Massachusetts diploma, an expansion which will ensure that many non-U.S. citizens are able to access in-state tuition and financial aid rates at public higher education institutions in the Commonwealth.

Applying for need-based state financial aid as a "High School Completer" is a two-step process:

- Step 1: Complete the Student Application and Affidavit form (<u>click here</u> for High School Seniors or <u>click here</u> for all other applicants)
- Step 2: Complete the MASFA

The <u>MASFA</u> for the 2024-2025 academic year is now available! This form should be <u>completed as soon as possible</u>. Students can still complete the MASFA for the 2023-2024 academic year. This form should be completed by May 1 and no later than June 30, 2024.

Do you have free/reduced lunch and/or receive any financial assistance? If so, you qualify for a SAT fee waiver! A fee waiver covers the cost of up to two SAT tests and three SAT Subject Tests. It will also cover submitting college applications through the Common Application. If you need an SAT or ACT fee waiver please contact school counselor.


TEST OPTIONAL SCHOOLS: Test optional means that a school does not require SAT or ACT scores as a part of your application. Over 1,000 colleges and universities are test optional. Find a complete list at www.fairtest.org!

THE TOEFL EXAM: The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) is a standardized test that measures English language ability for non-native speakers who plan to enroll in an English speaking college. The test evaluates listening, reading, writing, and speaking skills in relationship to academic tasks. Test costs range between \$150-\$225. Unfortunately, no financial aid is offered for the TOEFL test. Fee-based and free prep materials can be found on the <u>TOEFL website</u>, on <u>Canvas</u>, or in the College & Career Center (K007).
