HOW DO I APPLY?

The type of application a scholarship uses is listed at the bottom of the name/description. Please be aware of the directions below for how to submit scholarships:

Scholarships with PRIVATE APPLICATIONS:

Scholarships with private applications should be submitted to the address and/or email indicated on its unique application, which can be found in the newsletter below and/or on Naviance.

Scholarships using the FHS APPLICATION:

Scholarships using the FHS application should be emailed to Mrs. Erikson, College & Career Counselor, at rschmid@framingham.k12.ma.us. Copies of the FHS application can be found on Naviance; the essay topic can be found in the black box at the top of the application.

If a scholarship uses an FHS application, it should be submitted to Ms. Erikson on ONE EMAIL that includes the application and the essay as a PDF ATTACHMENT, with the <u>scholarship</u> name as the <u>subject line</u>.

APPLYING TO COLLEGE - PLEASE READ:

 Make sure you double check your deadlines and submit ahead of time (be sure to hit submit in Common App or electronic application). You do not have to wait until school documents are submitted for you to submit your application. You may submit your application when you are done!



- Be sure you have spoken with your counselor.
- Check in with the teachers who are writing your letters of recommendation to make sure they know a) which colleges to which you would like their letters sent b) the deadlines for your colleges.
- If Standardized Test Scores are required, make sure you send your scores from the College Board or ACT website as soon as possible.
- Check the financial aid requirements and deadlines for each of your schools.

***Once you have submitted, make sure you do the following in the days and weeks after your deadlines:

- If your schools have portals, be sure to log in to make sure that your colleges have all the materials they need and that you have a complete application.
- Please be sure to check your email every day. Colleges let students know about missing materials AND admissions decisions using email.
- If you are not able to check in a portal, you can call the admissions offices to make sure that they have a complete file. This should happen a couple of weeks after the deadline, as it takes colleges some time to process all materials.


THE COMMON APPLICATION

The **COLLEGE APPLICATION** is the backbone of all of the information a college/university needs to know about you to assess if you'd be a good fit for their school. The majority of schools use the **Common Application** as their application portal. Some schools have an application portal built into their website, and other schools use an application portal called the **Coalition** App (similar to the Common App; see schools that use the



Coalition App <u>here</u>). Creating an account on any of these portals is free, but most colleges/universities have a cost associated with applying. All applications are created and submitted online.

TEACHER LETTER(S) OF RECOMMENDATION

Seniors applying to four-year colleges will most likely need one to two teacher letters of recommendation. However, they will need to find out the exact number required by checking the "application requirements" on the websites of the colleges to which they are applying. To request a teacher letter of recommendation, please follow the steps listed on the <u>Teacher Recommendation Letter Guide</u>. You should always plan to give your teachers a minimum of 10-15 school days notice prior to your first application deadline.

Learn with Leaders is inviting applications for **The Autonomous**Mini - RACECAR (Robotics) Program - designed as an introductory course in robotics for students with some programming experience. In this course, students will be working with a virtual RACECAR in a custom-built simulation (designed by MIT Beaver Works Summer Institute).
