

INFORMAÇÕES GERAIS

ALUNOS E PROFESSORES

Informações sobre matrícula dos alunos e qualificação dos professores.

Alunos com deficiência: Alunos com necessidades especiais que tenham um Programa de Educação Individualizada (IEP - Individualizad Education Program).

OPORTUNIDADES ACADÊMICAS

RESPONSABILIDADE

Informações sobre os resultados de prestação de contas mais recentes da escola ou do distrito. O sistema de responsabilização reúne um conjunto de medidas para fornecer informações claras e acionáveis sobre o desempenho do distrito e da escola que podem ser usadas para ajudar as escolas a melhorarem.

Progresso em relação aos objetivos de melhoria: O Departamento de Educação Elementar e Secundária de Massachusetts (DESE - Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education) estabelece metas anuais de melhoria, ou objetivos, para todos os distritos e escolas. São estabelecidas metas para realização, crescimento, progresso dos principiantes da língua inglesa, falta crônica, conclusão do ensino médio e conclusão de curso avançado. As escolas e distritos devem apresentar progressos anuais referentes a essas metas a fim de melhorar o desempenho dos alunos, e os relatórios do DESE sobre o progresso de cada escola e distrito todos os anos.

Percentil de responsabilização: Os percentis de responsabilização indicam o desempenho geral de uma escola em comparação com outras escolas. O percentil da escola é calculado com a combinação das informações relacionadas à realização, crescimento, progresso dos principiantes da língua inglesa, falta crônica, conclusão do ensino médio e conclusão de curso avançado. Escolas com percentis mais altos geralmente apresentam desempenho mais elevados e as escolas com percentis mais baixos geralmente apresentam desempenho inferior. Os distritos não recebem um percentil de responsabilização.

Classificação geral: As escolas e os distritos são colocados em duas categorias: os que requerem assistência ou intervenção do estado, e os que não necessitam. Um pequeno número de escolas e distritos, incluindo os novos ou muito pequenos, são classificados como tendo "dados insuficientes".















Student Progress

Student growth measures the amount of academic progress a student made over the year, based on MCAS. It compares a student's MCAS performance to other students with similar past MCAS scores. Growth is reported on a scale from 1 to 99, with lower numbers representing lower progress and higher numbers representing higher progress. An average growth score between 40 and 60 means that the district or school is making typical progress.












































































