Health and Safety Protocols



Masking

- Masks are highly encouraged, but optional.
- Students who ask for a mask will be provided one.

Covid Testing

- Optional Testing (Rapid Only) Available at Toll,
 Crescenta Valley, and Glendale High School
- At-home tests available upon request
- At-home tests are good for 6 months after expiration date

Health and Safety Protocols (Cont.)

If COVID-19 Positive:

- Isolate at home and contact the heath office 818-249-3241.
- Isolate at least five days from the onset of symptoms
- May return if fever free without medication, symptoms are resolved and test negative
- If continue to test positive, may return to school on day #11 from the onset of symptoms

Close Contacts:

- Must wear a high grade mask indoors for 10 days regardless of vaccination status. If identified as a close contact, student will not be required to quarantine, but must wear a mask.
- If there is a positive case is in a classroom, the entire class will be masking while indoors for 10 full days regardless of their vaccination status.

Inclement Weather

- Rainy Day Mornings
 - TK/K Students gather in kinder hallway
 - 1st-6th Grade students gather under the lunch shelter/auditorium
- Rainy Day/Scorcher Day (temp above 89°): Students eat lunch under the lunch shelter or in the auditorium and recess is spent indoors.

Food Services

GUSD is asking that ALL families fill out the Meal & Other Benefits Application in order for our district to receive important state and federal funding. Qualifying families may receive other additional benefits from completing the application.

Free snack (at recess) and lunch are available for ALL students as well as after school snacks for students attending CDCC. Students may also bring food from home.

If students would like a second snack or lunch, they may purchase one. A la carte items (ex. bottled water, baked chips, etc) are also available for purchase.

Food (Continued)

- Please do not include candy, junk food or soft drinks in your child's lunch.
- Prepare lunches that your children like, and have them participate in packing their lunch.
- Pack lunches that are easy to access and easy to eat (e.g. a sandwich as opposed to soup in a hard-to-open container and no spoon) and practice opening food containers with your children.
- Check the cafeteria menu (<u>www.gusd.net</u> under family resources: lunch menu) and decide if there are days your child wants a school lunch.
- If there is an item your child is allergic to, you may add an alert on the point of sale with a doctor's note.
- Students should not bring glass containers of any kind, play or run in the eating area; trade, share, or collect food.

General Information

- Attendance: Students are to be in school, on time every day they are not sick
- Parties/Invites: Invitations should not be given out at school. Please do not bring any food items to celebrate birthdays. You may arrange with the teacher to bring non-food item (i.e. pencils, books, etc.)
- Lost and Found: Please label jackets, backpacks, lunchboxes, water bottles, etc. with your child's first and last name. Lost items that are not picked up will be donated at various times during the year.
- Classroom Interruptions are not Allowed. Please make sure your child is prepared for school each day with their materials prior to dropping them off.
- **Phones/Smart Watches** must be turned off and put away in backpacks during the school day unless a student has permission from a staff member to use for a specific reason.

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports(PBIS) and Behavioral Expectations

Friday Spirit Days

School Safety

- Visiting Campus: Must Be Scheduled; Must Sign In
- Monthly Safety Drills (Fire, Earthquake, Lockdown)
- Make sure your child dresses appropriately for the weather and wears closed-toed shoes good for PE and recess
- When your child is in your care at school, please make sure you are supervising them.
- Safety is a priority during drop off and pick up. **DO NOT block** or **park** in **driveways**, **double park**, or make **U-turns** in the middle of the street. Do not park illegally in handicapped spots. Make sure to always use crosswalks.

Safety and Volunteering

- Complete the Volunteer Agreement Form (being updated)
- Provide Proof of Negative TB Clearance
- Provide Proof of Covid vaccination OR negative COVID test within 48 hours
- Follow all GUSD safety requirements and visitors code of conduct.
- Must Be Scheduled; No "drop-ins"

Drop Off

- You may either park and walk or drive up in the drive-thru lane on Paloma. If your child needs assistance exiting the car, please park and walk.
- Student walkers may enter through the gate on Las Palmas or Paloma. The drive up lane is only on Paloma. The Arlington gate is for SAI Self-Contained classes only.
- 4th-6th Grade Students riding a bike/scooter must enter through the Las Palmas Avenue entrance and walk their bike/scooter to the racks by the lunch benches. Bikes should be locked up. Helmets must be worn.
- Gates will close promptly at 8:05. Late students need to enter through the office and get a late/tardy note.

Pick Up

- Student in the after school program will be picked up by CDCC staff
- TK: All pick up will be in front of the school on Las Palmas Please park your car and walk to the grass area in front of the school for pick up.
- <u>Kindergarten</u>: All pick up is on Paloma (K Teachers will give more information during Sneak Peek).
- SAI Self-Contained Classes: All pick up will be at the Arlington Ave gate

Pick Up 1st-6th Grades

- Drive Up on Paloma (1st-6th Grades): Please make an easily visible <u>Car Sign</u> with your child's first and last name and display on your dashboard.
- Walking Gate on Las Palmas only (1st-6th Grades): Teachers will walk students to the front gate and release students to waiting caregiver.

• Students Walking Home on Their Own (4th-6th Grade): If you would like your child to walk home on their own, please send an email to your child's teacher and the school secretary, Marina Balasanian mbalasanian@gusd.net, giving permission to do so.
