

The Teen and Police Partnership (TAPP) is a collaboration between the Glendale Police Department and the Glendale Unified School District.

The program is for middle school and high school students who struggle with attendance and/or making better life choices.

TAPP is an 8-week program held on Thursday evenings from 6-7:30 pm. The goal of the program is to raise awareness about relevant topics that affect educational success and encourages your student to take responsibility for their future. The program requires parent/guardian participation. Parents/guardians will have an opportunity to attend informational sessions that are relevant to them and encourages partnership and engagement with the students.

Students will complete a community enrichment project and participate in a graduation ceremony where they will receive a certificate of completion and community service hours for participating in the program.
