### **Grades and Credits**

#### "A, B, or C" grades = 5 credits

Receive credit towards graduation and college admission criteria

Given extra GPA bonus for Honors/AP classes

#### "D" grades = 5 credits

Credit for high school graduation only!

"D" grades don't count for college admission.

Not given extra GPA point for Honors/AP classes

#### "F" grades = 0 credits

If you fail a required graduation course you MUST make it up in summer school or the next year.

✓ C grades CANNOT be made-up/repeated
 ✓ Repeated courses DO NOT earn duplicate credits
 (GPA is altered but original grade is still posted)

Students are responsible to repeat courses as needed.



# Summer School Tentative Options

**Credit Recovery/Support:** To repeat Fs for required graduation requirements or repeat Ds for "a-g" eligibility.

Students with Ds in Integrated Math I or II consider repeating to strengthen skills. Your counselor will discuss during 1-1 meetings.

#### **Advancement:**

Select courses will be available with GUSD Summer School.

Outside programs such as OFL-OP, OFY, and GCC-SSC require prior counselor approval.

- OFL/OFY dates of attendance will begin July 1<sup>st</sup>.
- GCC-SSC dates of attendance will begin June 20th.


