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## **Intervention Class Descriptions:**

### **Lit for Success:**

Students enrolled in Lit for Success have demonstrated a need for an academic intervention due to multiple low grades in a variety of courses. These students do not fall under any other sub groups like ELD students or students with IEPs. Students in this class work in small groups, or individually, with their assigned academic mentor based on their academic skills. The academic mentor will help the students in a wide range of academic areas and assess daily productivity in the Lit for Success class. Academic mentors will also provide support in helping students stay organized, engaged, motivated, and serve as a role model and friend to these students who need a trustworthy and reliable person in their daily lives.

#### Resource Lab:

Students enrolled in Resource Lab all have Individualized Education Plans due to an eligibility that ranges from an autism spectrum disorder (ASD) to a specific learning disability (SLD). The needs of each student differ. Despite the challenges and/or barriers to learning these students may have, it is important to remember that their academic performance does not reflect their academic ability. The academic mentor will help the students in a wide range of academic subjects and understanding socially appropriate behaviors, both of which are equally important.

### > Math Intervention:

Students enrolled in Intervention Math have demonstrated a poor foundation in mathematics. As a result, they lack confidence in their math skills and need support. Students in this class will work in small groups with their assigned academic mentor. The academic mentor will help the students with a wide range of mathematical concepts mostly related Integrated Math I and Integrated Math II. Academic mentors will also provide support in helping students stay organized, engaged, motivated, and serve as a role model.

### > Science Intervention:

Students enrolled in Intervention Science have demonstrated a poor foundation in Living Earth (former title: biology), Chemistry in the Earth Systems (former title: chemistry), or Physics of the Universe. As a result, they lack confidence in their science skills and need support. Students in this class will work in small groups with their assigned academic mentor. The academic mentor will help the students with concepts in Living Earth, Chemistry in the Earth Systems, or Physics of the Universe. Academic mentors will also provide support in helping students stay organized, engaged, motivated, and serve as a role model.

# **English Language Development:**

Students enrolled in English Language Development (ELD) are recent immigrants with low skills in the spoken and written English language. There are times when students new to the English language, in the beginning and intermediate ELD levels, may display academic struggles in multiple subject areas. Students in this class work in small groups, or individually, with their assigned academic mentor based on their academic skills. The academic mentor will help the students in a wide range of academic areas, mostly related to improving their understanding and use of the English language. Academic mentors will also provide support in helping students stay organized, engaged, motivated, and serve as a role model and friend to these students who have newly arrived to the United States.
