ACADEMICS

Academics are a priority at Hoover High School. There are numerous programs that honor and support our students including the **Principal's Honor Roll** and Academic medals. Successful students and their families are honored at the annual **Top Tornos Ceremony** and the **Senior Awards** event.

Tornos can participate in academic opportunities in and out of the classroom such as the annual **Scholastic Bowl**, over **20 AP courses**, local science fairs and the Jet Propulsion Laboratory programs to apply their knowledge and gain recognition for their efforts. HHS won the Scholastic Bowl in 2013 and 2014.

Distinguished Scholars Academy (DSA) is an elite program for Hoover students who hold themselves to a higher standard in academics and who demonstrate exceptional citizenship. Students involved in the program are offered AP Human Geography as Freshmen. The students benefit from programs such as a lunch-time speaker series, college visits, college selection workshops, guidance on their college applications, and four year members are honored at their graduation ceremony.

The Hoover Media Arts Academy (MAAc) is a school within a school that allows students to major in the Visual and Performing Arts while pursuing their high school diploma. MAAc provides traditional and interdisciplinary project-based learning in the evolving field of arts and media. MAAc students work with professional artists to create portfolios aimed at college admittance and careers in the arts. Alumni have distinguished themselves as animators, graphic and fashion designers, curators, illustrators, and authors.

PROGRAMS

The Public Safety Academy (PSA) is an exciting program in which students explore Public Safety Careers. Through PSA, students and alumni work or volunteer in local fire department and police department agencies, seeing first hand what a career in public safety requires. PSA is a character building program that guides young men and women toward success in college, careers, and life.



Hoover High School Culinary Arts program introduces the students to the food service profession. The classroom environment is managed similarly to a professional kitchen; professional culinary skills and work ethics are taught. Hoover is a member of Careers Through Culinary Arts Program (CCAP), a school-to-career program that links public high schools to the food service industry by offering students training, internships, and scholarships. For each of the last ten years, Hoover has had a culinary arts student awarded a scholarship through CCAP to a reputable professional culinary program.
