

Cell Phones

You may bring a cell phone to school with your parents' permission. Cell phones that are brought to school will be at the parent's/student's own risk. If brought to school, the cell phone may not be used until after school. It must be turned off and may NOT be out during the school day.

- 1. <u>First Offense</u>: Warning, policy form signed, phone returned to student at the end of the day
- 2. <u>Second Offense</u>: Parent/guardian must sign a policy form in the AP's office. Phone will be returned to the parent.
- 3. <u>Third Offense</u>: Parent/guardian must sign a policy form in AP's office. Phone returned to parents. Consequences assigned to student (suspension, loss of phone privilege).

At any time, consequences may be administered as deemed necessary by administration. Glendale Unified School District will not be responsible for any item that is lost, damaged, or stolen. Please note that students can use the telephone at the attendance office for emergencies or after school to contact parents.
