Course Title: Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (AFJROTC) Drill and Ceremonies

Course Number:

Grade Levels: 9, 10, 11, 12

Semester Hours: 5

Prerequisite: Students must be concurrently enrolled in an AFJROTC AS-I, AS-II, AS-III, or AS-IV Course

Course Description: The AFJROTC Drill and Ceremonies course provides fundamental and in-depth instruction in Air Force Drill and Ceremonies. The fundamentals of Drill and Ceremonies, to include cadet ability to perform the AFJROTC 30-step drill sequence at the appropriate level commensurate with their enrollment experience, are taught as a part of the Leadership Education component for each AFJROTC class. The AFJROTC Drill and Ceremonies course concentrates in greater depth the elements of military drill, individual and group precision movements, procedures for saluting, drill, ceremonies, reviews, parades, and development of command voice. Students are provided detailed instruction on ceremonial performances and protocol for civilian and military events, and have the opportunity to personally learn Air Force drill concepts and procedures. Students enrolled in the AFJROTC Drill and Ceremonies course will conduct nearly fifty public events annually to include Color Guard ceremonies, Military Honor details at Riverside National Cemetery, and participation in community parades.

I. Objectives

Objectives are focused to have the student:

- A. Know the importance of drill and ceremonies.
- B. Know basic commands and characteristics of the command voice.

- C. Apply and execute the concepts and principles of basic drill positions and movements.
- D. Know when and how to salute.

- E. Apply the principles and procedures of drill movements used with smaller units to the movement of a squadron.
 - F. Know the function of the group and the wing.
 - G. Know how groups and wings are formed.
 - H. Know the purpose and definition of ceremonies and parades.
- II. Lessons will enable the student to achieve the following towards attainment of overall Course Objectives:
- A. Lesson Objective One: Know the importance of Drill and Ceremonies.
 - 1. Samples of Behavior:
 - a. State the importance of drill and ceremonies.
 - b. List the symbols that represent the leaders of the flight as squadron.
 - c. List all the basic military drill terms.
 - B. Lesson Objective Two: Know basic commands and characteristics of the command voice.
 - 1. Samples of Behavior:
 - a. Identify the types of commands used during the basic military drill movements.
 - b. Identify the necessary qualities of the command voice.
 - c. Define cadence.
 - C. Lesson Objective Three: Perform basic drill positions and movements.

1. Sample of Behavior:
 - a. Execute various movements and positions of basic drill when given the command to do so.

D. Lesson Objective Four: Perform parade movements as a flight.

1. Samples of Behavior:
 - a. Execute the various marching movements.
 - b. Execute proper military position and place prior to parade.

- c. Respond with proper military procedures for entire parade sequence.

E. Lesson Objective Five: Perform drill movements as a squadron.

1. Samples of Behavior:
 - a. Execute basics drill commands as a squadron.
 - b. Execute guidon bearer procedures.

F. Lesson Objective Six: Demonstrate a group and wing formation.

1. Sample of Behavior:
 - a. Perform group and wing formations when given the command to do so.

G. Lesson Objective Seven: Know the purpose and definition of ceremonies and parades.

1. Samples of Behavior:
 - a. Define ceremony and parade.
 - b. State the purpose of ceremonies and parades.
 - c. Identify the different types of ceremonies and parades.
 - d. Define reveille and retreat.

- e. State when it is appropriate to raise and lower the flag.
