Course Title: Korean 1-2

Grade Level: 9, 10, 11, 12

Semester Hours: 10

Prerequisite: None

Course Description: This course is open to students who have no or very limited knowledge

of Korean. The course emphasizes the development of basic communication skills through intensive exercise and practice of sample patterns of dialogue and basic grammar. This course is action-centered oral practice with basic Korean sentence structures. Hangul, the Korean alphabet, will be introduced for reading and writing. The following goals and outline of objectives are aligned with the State Model Curriculum

Guidelines.

- B. Develop a basic knowledge of Korean grammar and the ability to use it in constructing simple sentences.

- D. Develop ability to communicate orally in classroom activities with each other and with the teacher in Korean.

 - B. Speaking The student will be able to communicate orally in Korean by:
 - 1. Pronouncing vocabulary words in non-structured exercises
 - 2. Responding to oral questions with appropriate response
 - 3. Participating in oral language drills
 - 4. Asking simple questions
 - 5. Making statements about, or describing, items under Part II of this outline
 - 6. Presenting dialogues or reading aloud
 - C. Reading The student will demonstrate to read basic Korean and to practice vocabulary and simple sentences in the classroom by:
 - 1. Reading aloud with correct pronunciation and intonation
 - 2. Understanding material presented in reading selections

- D. Writing The student will demonstrate ability to apply Korean grammar and usage in written form by:

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- 1. Writing vocabulary and sentences from dictation
- 2. Writing simple sentences based on grammar patterns as follows:
 - a. Nouns
 - (1) Singular and plural
 - b. Verbs
 - (1) Present
 - (2) Past
 - (3) Present and past progressive
 - c. Pronouns
 - (1) Subjective pronouns
 - (2) Objective pronouns
 - (3) Interrogative pronouns
 - d. Interrogative words: When, Where, Who, What, How, Why
 - e. Adjectives
 - f. Prepositions
 - g. Adverbs
 - h. Cardinal and ordinal numbers
- E. Culture The student will become aware of cultural differences and understand the uniqueness of the Korean culture and people while learning each chapter.
