The student will demonstrate his ability to communicate with standard pronunciation and intonation by:

- 1. Asking and answering predictable questions pertaining to everyday life or the assigned readings
- 2. Giving detailed directions
- 3. Making statements about everyday situations or the assigned readings

The student will demonstrate his ability to read standard and un-edited Spanish newspapers, magazines, short stories, and longer works of fiction and/or non-fiction

#### D. Writing

The student will demonstrate his ability to write using acceptable standard Spanish by:

- 1. Writing short and/or long answers in sentences or paragraph form
- 2. Summarizing stories or other materials
- 3. Utilizing the appropriate time frame and mood
- 4. Creating original works such as dialogues, skits, poems, cartoons, short stories, essays, etc.
- 5. Using standard idiomatic expressions
