College View School is a place where great things happen for kids every day. The school was established in 1977 to provide for the educational needs of students with extraordinary special needs. As research in the field of education has provided more information about teaching students with special needs, College View has updated its programming and philosophy. Now College View boasts research-based educational strategies and innovative programs to help all students reach the highest level of independence and to provide the least restrictive educational environment for Glendale, Burbank, and La Canada students with severe disabilities.

In the 2011-2012 school year, College View furthered its focus on communication development and functional independent living skills. We continued to meet targets for student progress and implement our school wide formative assessment – The CVCR: College View Communication Rubric, designed to assist teachers and staff in identifying student's specific communication behaviors and informing instruction and next steps. F.I.S.H. Scales was also utilized to establish proper Functional Independent Skills for each individual student. The independent skills ranged from choosing the correct utensil for eating to preparing food.

We continue to implement Arts Attack, a district wide elementary arts curriculum; the results of this year long program were a student art gallery and participation in the Very Special Arts Festival. We also continued our efforts to provide our students with peer and mentor interactions.
