About This School

Franklin Elementary Magnet – International Foreign Language Academy of Glendale (IFLAG) was awarded a federal magnet grant, which will continue the transition of Franklin into a full dual language immersion school. The German, Italian, French and Spanish immersion programs will expand along with implementation of standards-based curriculum and assessments being developed in the target languages. Critical thinking, visual arts and drama curriculum is integrated into the program with professional development and coaching provided for all teachers.

Students attending Franklin receive an enriched program that promotes bilingual, biliterate, and multicultural proficiency, which meet state standards. The dual immersion program follows the 90/10 model where 90% of the instruction in kinder and first grade is provided in the target language and 10% is provided in English. As the grades increase, the percentage of English instruction increases by ten percent each year until it levels off in fifth grade when it becomes a 50/50 model.

We promote high expectations for our students by focusing on student data to drive instruction through the use of our best practices to increase student achievement. Our best practices are to focus on the components of highly effective lessons, differentiation to meet individual student needs, and actively engaging students in lessons.

Franklin Magnet School implements a positive discipline initiative called Be SMART, (**S**olve Programs; **M**ake Good Decisions; **A**ct Responsibly; **R**espect Yourself, Others and the World Around You; and **T**ake a Second Make a Difference).
