### **About This School**

Toll middle School is a high performing school located in the northern section of the city of Glendale and serves students in grades six through eight on a traditional calendar system. Through a rigorous, standardsbased instructional program, the teachers, administrators, and support staff place an emphasis on academic achievement for all students while guiding them through the social and emotional complexities of adolescence. In addition to our strong academic program, students at Toll Middle School are nurtured by a school climate that holds high expectations for promoting respect, cooperation, courtesy, and acceptance of others. Cultural diversity is fostered through student involvement in various campus enhancements, including the recent painting of a multi-cultural mural in the common lunch area. Lunchtime teambuilding activities are coordinated through our active associated student body to promote unity and spirit. The underlying belief of the school's mission is that students who develop a sense of personal responsibility will mature both academically and emotionally. We encourage students to participate in the school's varied additional academic and extracurricular activities that promote positive attitudes and encourage involvement and a sense of belonging. To build self-esteem and recognize student achievement, we present various awards to students at assemblies and special presentations throughout the school year. Toll is organized into teams ("cores") of English, social studies, and science teachers who share a group of students. This structure provides a personalized environment where students and teachers can get to know each other well. Each core promotes parent involvement in both academic and social activities, and the school's Parent, Teacher Association (PTA) supports the team through field trips, supplies, and volunteerism on a regular basis. Technology is incorporated into the classroom through the use of SMART board, document cameras and student computers.
