We are proud of our accomplishments, including recognition as a California Distinguished school in 2000 and 2004 and our Academic Performance Index (API), which has increased 138 points over the past thirteen years to 935 in 2012. In addition to our traditional program our Japanese Dual Language (JDL) program (now in its second year) offers students the opportunity to become bilingual and biliterate in both English and Japanese, thereby expanding their horizons and opportunities in our growing global society. Our school community continues the many traditions that bring our school and families together, including our Fall Festival, the Dad's Club Pancake Breakfast, the "Survivor Challenge", our themed Family reading Night, and Fathers' Follies to name just a few. Our parents are a critical component of our success. The Verdugo Woodlands' Parent Teacher Association (PTA) and Woodlanders are Volunteers for Education Foundation (W.A.V.E.) provide outstanding supplemental educational experiences for our students. In 2011-2012 these included the Meet the Masters fine arts program, an after-school Drama-Theater Arts Program, and financial assistance for student activities and intervention support programs.
