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Following slides include responses to questions regarding the Territory Transfer.

Bridge and Park Area

Can GUSD own property in another district? Yes

Negotiation Options:

- Align LCUSD boundary with City of La Canada's boundary, but GUSD retain ownership
- Draw Boundary to not include the bridge/park area and GUSD retain ownership

Bridge and Park Area

Negotiation Options (Cont.):

 Align LCUSD boundary with City of La Canada's boundary and City obtains ownership of bridge/park -District retains access

Transfer without Negotiations:

 Per Ed Code: The Bridge/park ownership is transferred to LCUSD and property owners in LCUSD are required to pay all outstanding Measure K/S bonds (approx. 25 years - \$6.8 million)

Note: County Commission could unilaterally do a different allocation

LCUSD Proposal:

 Annual payments equal to Measure K/S obligation given to GUSD for 13 years (approx. \$4.2 million)

Can these payments be used for any purpose?

It Depends on the Funding Source

Annual Payments Tied to Outstanding Measure K/S Bonds:

- If the monies are from the City of La Canada or LCUSD and not related to a property tax assessment - GUSD can spend the monies however it choses
- If the monies are collected via property taxes on the property owners of La Canada - the money must be used to pay Measure K/S outstanding bond debt

Transfer without Negotiations:

 Per Ed Code: The bridge/park ownership is transferred to LCUSD and property owners in LCUSD are required to pay all outstanding Measure K/S bonds (approx. 25 years - \$6.8 million)

Note: County Commission could unilaterally do a different allocation

 Is LCUSD required to pay GUSD for the value of the bridge/park?

No, but if they take ownership of the bridge/park, they must take ownership of the Measure K/S payments on outstanding bonds (\$6.8 million)

 How will GUSD maintain enrollment at Mountain Avenue School?

Creating permissible attendance areas to allow students in those areas a choice of Mountain Avenue or their current school site:


- > Area currently assigned to Monte Vista 103 K-6 students
 - o Extend Mountain Avenue boundary to Rosemont Ave
- Area currently assigned to Fremont 213 K-6 students
 - Extend Mountain Avenue boundary to Honolulu Ave.


 How will GUSD maintain enrollment at Mountain Avenue School? (Cont.)
