

## CURBSIDE PICK-UP OF LIBRARY BOOKS

Fremont Elementary School Library







- Log into the library catalog by clicking on the login button in the upper right hand corner. Use your Google Classroom login.
- 3. You can search by title, author or keyword. You can also click on topics including mystery, fantasy and graphic novels.
- 4. You can borrow one book at a time for up to 3 weeks.




When you find the book you want to borrow, click "HOLD." You can see if the book is in or checked out from this page.

## How to Pick up Books

- Library service is available Tuesdays through Fridays from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and Fridays from 9:00 a.m to 2:00 p.m.
- Please remember to wear a mask and maintain social distancing. Your books will be in a plastic bag with your name on it.
- Books returned will sit for three days before they are cleaned and ready to borrow again.
