Behavior Management Flow Chart

Minor

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Is the Behavior Minor or Major?



Major



1st Infraction

- · Verbal Warning
- Re-teach expectation
- Begin classroom intervention
- Contact parent (teacher discretion)



2nd Infraction

- Class consequences
- Contact colleague or admin for further intervention/suggestions



3rd Infraction

- Minor becomes a major
- Write an office referral

Classroom Managed

- Physical contact (slight shoving or pushing, hanging on other students)
- Inappropriate language (stupid, idiot, dumb, what the hell)
- Drinking water/ not freezing after the bell
- Lying
- Disruption (interrupts classroom instruction or activity)
- Dress code
- Cheating
- Non-compliance (ex. assignments, homework)
- Property/technology/cellphone misuse
- Vandalism (minor damage to property)
- Annoying/harassing behavior or nuisance

Office Managed

- Physical fighting (actual fighting)
- Physical aggression (pushing with force, throwing/pushing furniture, slamming items down)
- Profanity and/or abusive language
- Repeat offender
- Theft
- Overt defiance
- Bullying
- Technology abuse
- Destruction of school/others' property
- Forgery (progress reports and tests)
- Threat
- Weapons

- Write Major ODR and send student to the office
- Conference with student
- Contact parent



- Administrator or designee determines action
- Administrator follows through on action with student
- Administrator provides teacher feedback

Classroom Interventions

- Re-direct/ re-teach
- Student reflection
- Prompt/ role play
- Contact parent/ conference with parent and student
- Reinforce 5 positives to 1 correction/ specific verbal feedback
- Private conversation with student
- Staff proximity
- Seat change
- Nonverbal/ visual cues
- Break/ think time/ quiet corner/ relaxation exercise
- Apology note
- Sensory/ movement break
- Buddy activity
- Modify assignments
- Incentives/ privilege
- Red Slip
- Community Circle

Administrative Interventions

- Loss of privileges
- Conference with parent
- Alternative activities/schedule
- Detention
- Community service
- Behavior contract
- In-house suspension
- At-home suspension
- Expulsion
- Contact support provider
- Restorative Justice Circles
- Alternative to Suspension (ATS-Saturday School)
